My dear Mr. Anderson:

We have your letter concerning enrollment in our  
four year physical education course and wish to  
assure you that we shall do everything in our power  
to make your work pleasant for you here.

If Mr. Festa sent your high school transcript to me,  
it had not reached me at the time your letter ar-  
rived. He may, of course, have addressed it to the  
Registrar of the University; that is where I shall  
send it when it does arrive. The Registrar must  
pass on your entrance.

I feel reasonably certain that the work you have done  
in Congers High School will satisfy our entrance re-  
quirements, which are stated on pages sixteen and  
seventeen of the University catalog which I am send-

him so that you will be sure that your entrance is clear.

Mr. Robert Fullem will be enrolled in many of the same  
classes with you. On page seventy-nine you will find  
the courses listed in which you will enroll during the  
four years of your college work. Both you and Mr. Fullem  
will be enrolled in Social Science Survey (five hours,  
instead of four as the catalog states), Personal Health,  
and Physical Education 31M. You may or may not be in  
the same rhetoric class. If you choose the same elective  
course, it is all right; that depends on your own wishes.
