We will always do our best on anything that you wish to dispose of.

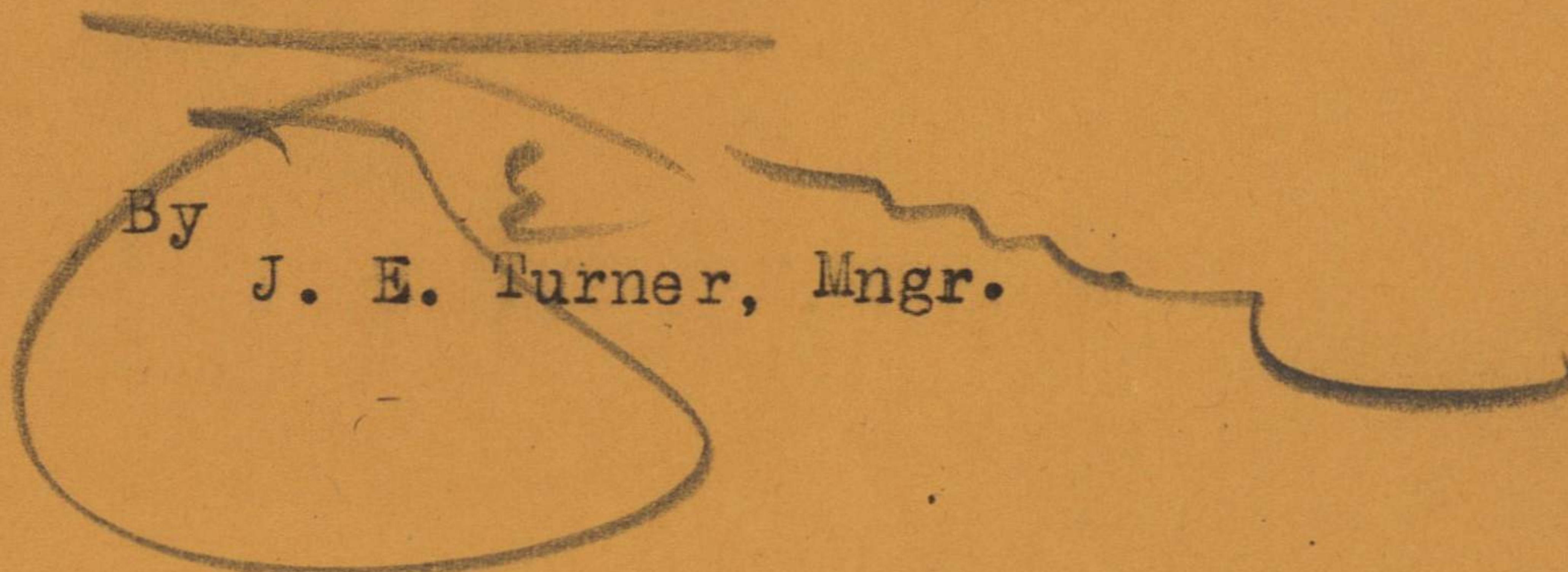

As for me and mine, Sir, as an Old Sergeant, I salute you!

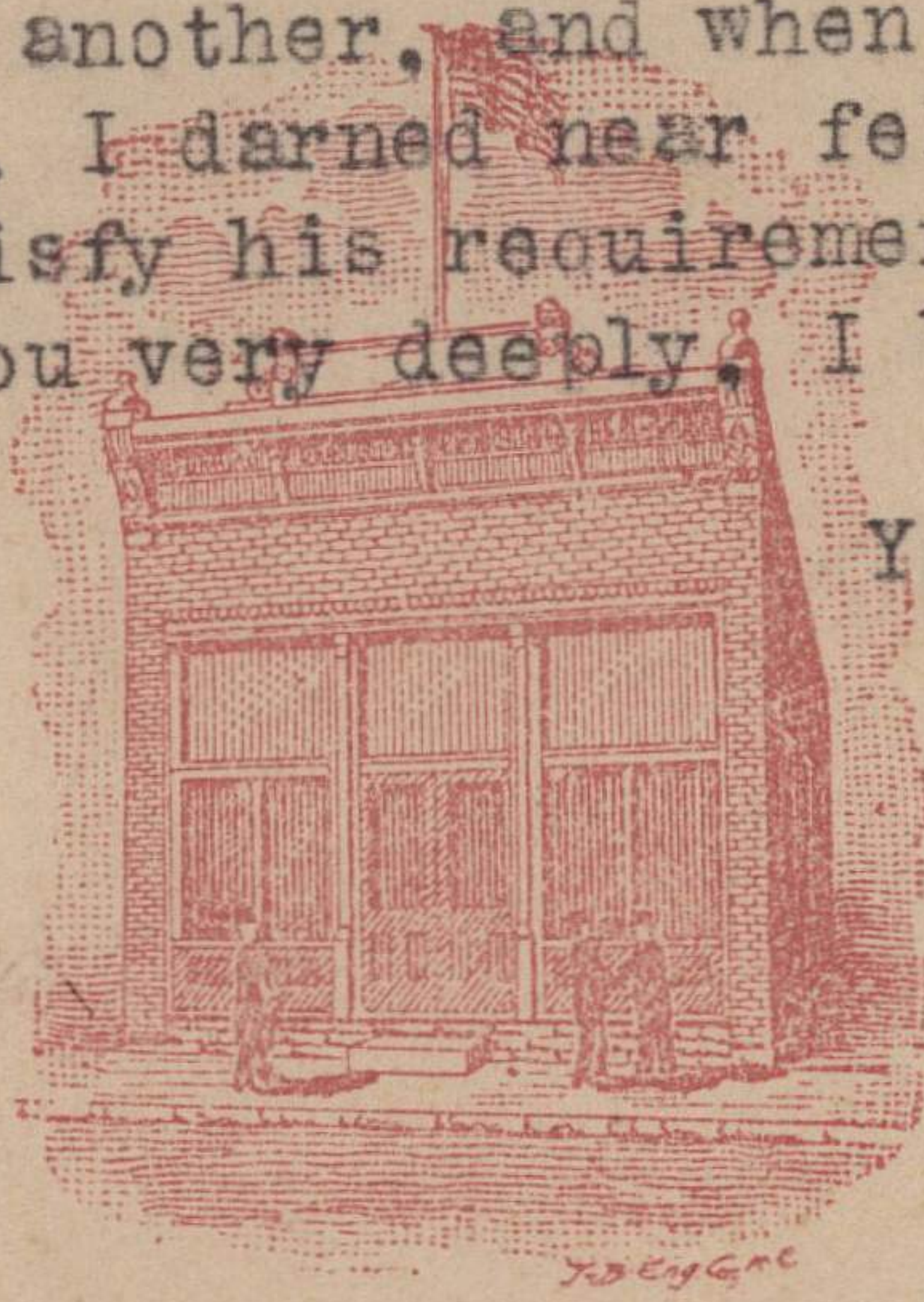
