Without having made any particular effort up to the present time, approximately \$1500.00 has been subscribed. It is not thought it will be necessary to ask for any specified sum. The committee has made a survey of the situation from the standpoint of our housing facilities and feels that an expenditure of approximately \$7500.00 should be made on the house at 1100 Indiana, in order to put it in a more sanitary and livable state.

We of course, know that you will be most willing and most happy to support this effort, but we are wondering specifically if you would undertake from time to time, if it becomes necessary, to write individual letters to brothers of your particular acquaintance, in order to further our efforts. As a matter of fact, that you might be able to do in this direction will be greatly appreciated.
