While home on leave I saw Wayne's parents and they are brave indeed. Mrs. News showed me the letters from Wayne's company and regimental commanders, a Captain and Colonel respectively. They praised Wayne as an officer and for his gallantry in action. Beside the Purple Heart medal he was awarded the Silver Star. Wayne's first sergeant was



hit and Wayne went out to get  
him. He, too, was hit. A slug  
tore through his stomach and  
he was taken aboard ship for  
treatment. Wayne lived over  
night, knew his number was  
up but took it like a soldier.

A sailor gave him a  
blood transfusion but to no  
avail. This sailor lay under

letters I have ever read. He  
was with Wayne until the end.



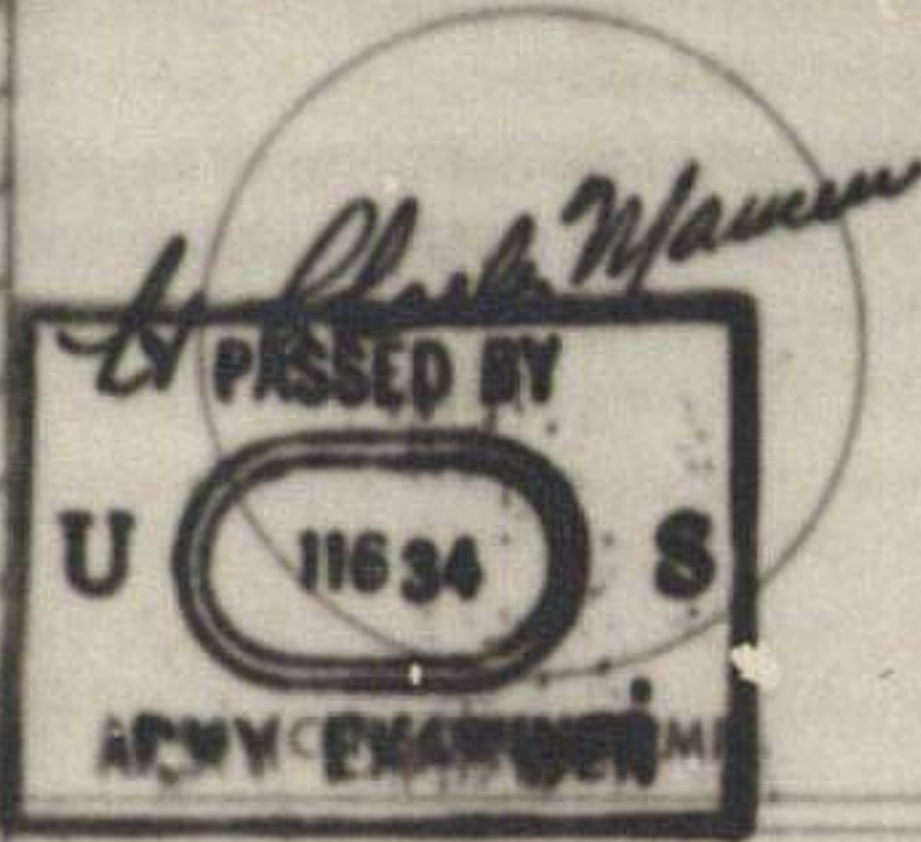
