

NATIONAL STUDENT SECTION

Schools were asked to approve or disapprove the formation of a National Student Section. Thirty institutions answered this question. As seen below, the great majority avored such a plan. The comments are listed below:

Approval Unconditionally 22

Approval Conditionally 4

if

1. Times were normal
2. Discussions were valuable
3. Discussions represented the ideas and interests of students
4. There is a need and if the section really functions
5. It holds one meeting that does not conflict with other important meetings
6. It does not become too highly organized
7. It is operated for and chiefly by the students
8. There is no cause for disillusionment of students because of feeble programs, etc.

Disapproval 4

because

1. State sections are more valuable
2. Distance is too great to attend Conventions
3. Expense is too great to attend Conventions
4. Other meetings are too valuable to miss by attending student meeting
5. It should be abandoned "for the duration"
6. Not enough effort is put on student sections to warrant their existence

Significant comments from questionnaires:

The inspiration derived by students in association with other students is of great value.

Early contact with their profession from a national viewpoint is most valuable.
