My dear Mr. Kellogg:

I want to thank you for your very frank letter which I have just received. I assure you that I can appreciate the forebodings that you have. I too share some of your ideas.

May I give you a short history of this funding of all things in one drive. The idea first started in Alabama and then spread to Indiana and some of the eastern states. In Alabama the people went to the governor and said, "There are so many solicitations, why can we not include them all in one?" It was started there and found to be successful.

Finally, this single giving had assumed such proportions that it was presented to the President of the United States. He approved it, and it now seems to be the rule rather than the exception.

I only mention this to show you that it is not a local proposition. You will understand I am not endeavoring to debate your arguments, because I have already told you that I agree with some of your reactions, but to get the thing done in this war time stress it is necessary to reduce the manpower problem perceptibly.

It is possible for you to make individual contributions to certain things. At our workers meeting this morning it was definitely stressed that if any individual wishes to make a particular contribution to a certain thing, all that will be necessary is to have you write on the back of your pledge card the organizations that you wish to benefit. Mark on the front of the card a reference to your statement on the back, and these organizations only will be credited with your contribution.

I still think you would make a fine solicitor because you have been discriminating in important questions. And a good solicitor is one who is well informed of the facts. Thank you so much.

Dear Dr. Allen:

I received your mimeographed request to serve on the University Committee for this War Fund and Community Chest campaign.

I am not a good solicitor anyway, but aside from that, in this particular case I could not be of sufficient service to the campaign, as it seems to be planned.

Naturally I am thoroughly in sympathy with the idea behind it all, and intend to help out financially to the limit of my resources; but I do not like the way this thing is being done this time at all.

I do not think that the Community Chest and the National so-called War Fund should be combined. I also do not see any way for an individual contributor to state where or how he should like his own money to go--that is to what particular organizations. I think that is not only his right, but is an essential part of a proper solicitation campaign.

Hitherto, in my own case, for instance, I have been glad to assist various of the organizations and groups (both in the Community Chest group, and others in what are now included in the War Fund group) but I have not been in entire sympathy with the policies or methods of spending of certain other organizations, and I think I have a right to differentiate among them.

Not to have this privilege is to spoil the whole idea and morale building effect of such a charity campaign, and turn it into just another form of general tax.

I may be mistaken in this assumption of mine, but it<sup>is</sup> what I gather from conversation, and the form of the contribution card you sent me. If I am mistaken, please let me know, for I would not want to have a false impression. At any rate you see I would not make a good solicitor! So please excuse me from that duty, which otherwise would have been a privilege.

Dear C. G.:

At the war plants and all of the industries they are asking that each worker give the equivalent of one day's wages toward the National War Fund drive. The other drives have been "loan drives" for the benefit of the individual.
