

Kansas Wins 3-Way Meet

Lawrence, Kas. (AP)—By winning eight firsts, tying for another and taking 13 second places the University of Kansas track team swamped the Nebraska Cornhuskers and the Kansas Aggies in a triangular track meet Saturday.

The scores were Kansas 85, Nebraska 37, Kansas State 12.

Robert Lillibridge of Hutchinson won the 220-yard dash and broad jump and took second in the 100-yard dash for Kansas, scoring 13 points for high honors.

Nebraska had three double winners in Dean Kratz, 440 and 880-yard runs; Ken Hollins, shot put and discus;; and Norville Barker, both hurdle races.

Kansas State won no firsts, and Tom Keith gave the Wildcats their only second place, scoring in the low hurdles.

Halstead Is Meet Winner

Halstead won the Mid-Kansas league track and field meet at Gowans field here Saturday with a grand total of 46 points.

Haven was second with 39, Pretty Prairie third with 30, Burrton made 26, Buhler 13, and Inman and Moundridge each scored 11.
