The shatterproof glasses that our boys wore in basketball were prescription glasses which we obtained through an oculist. The boys, of course, took the glasses with them when they finished school, and of course they would not fit anyone else.

I would suggest that you might get some eye glass protectors for the boy, such as are sold by the athletic goods firms. These are inexpensive in comparison to the shatterproof glasses, and fit right over the glasses much like a softball catcher's mask. If you have access to a Lowe & Campbell Athletic Goods catalog you will find a description of them, or you might write to the firm in Kansas City, if you are interested.
