



The Athletic Association has a rule that everybody has to pay
government tax. The tax on these tickets for the top balcony
is 10¢ It will be necessary that the adults pay 50¢ admission.
The Athletic Association has a very strict rule regarding passes.
The rule of the Big Six is that if you give passes you have to
pay the visiting team face value for the price of the pass.

The top balcony is the second balcony and while these seats
provide a wonderful view of the game, they are quite a ways re-
moved from the playing floor, but they are almost directly over
it. The seats are about 50 feet from the floor. It will be
necessary that you pay 50¢ for the ticket for your girl friend
in case you desire to make use of this opportunity. This offer
will be for the Denver University game on December 17 which is
Wednesday night. If you decide to come I trust that you will let
us know so that Mr. Falkenstien can make arrangements for your
tickets.

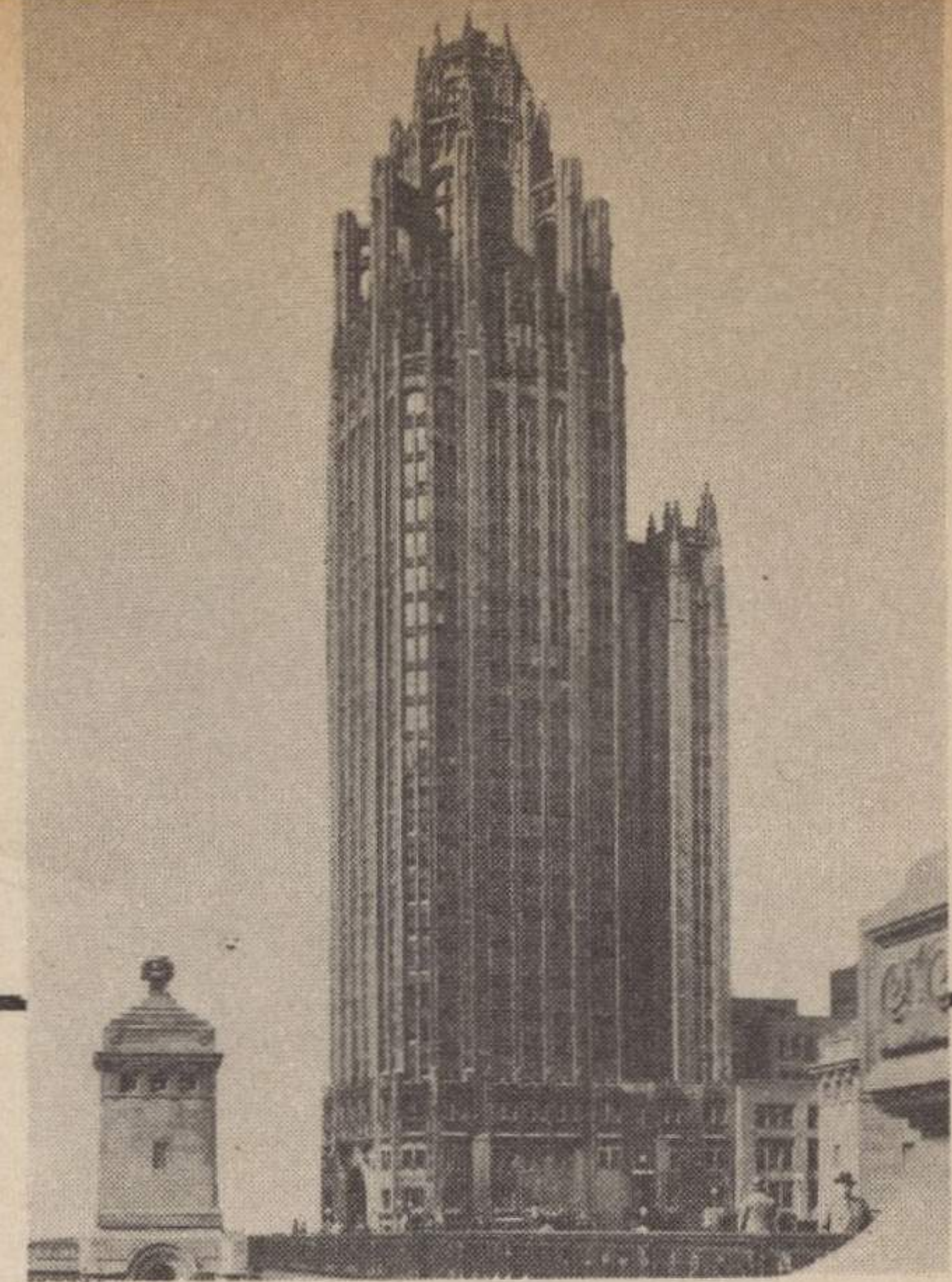




Mr. C. G. Bayles has forwarded to the writer the letter you have recently written to him concerning the changing of our bus stop on the west end of the campus.
