Dear Mr. Wilson:

Mr. C. G. Bayles has shown me your letter  
to him as of November 22nd.

The reason I wrote to Mr. Bayles was because  
of the traffic hazard caused by the bus making a stop  
so close to the turn at the west end of the campus. I  
suggest that the bus move about fifty feet forward.

The cars are cutting to the left of the circle  
and people coming from the south and west and people  
going to the east makes it a bottleneck when the bus  
stops. If your driver could stop fifty feet further  
down it would be as easy for the passengers, and would  
definitely relieve a bad traffic situation.
