The price of Chlorine out of Kansas City, Missouri stock is $8\frac{1}{2}\%$ per pound fob Lawrence, Kansas, with cylinder deposits and rentals waived. Terms are 1% discount for payment in ten days, net thirty days. Empty cylinders are all returned to us at Niagara Falls, New York, via rail freight collect.

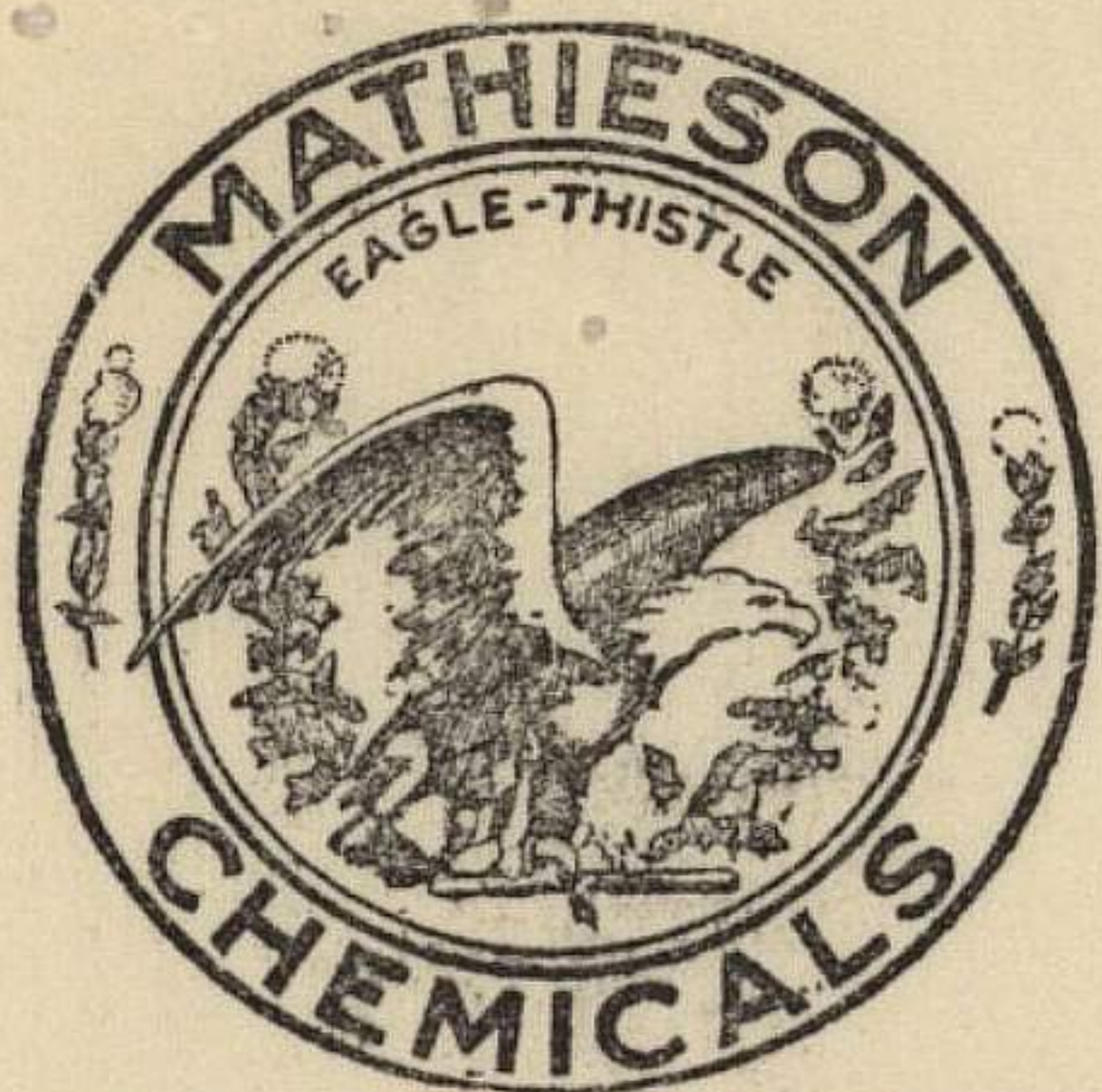

We have your letter of October 8th with reference to our charge for 40 months rental on cylinder #25995.

You will no doubt realize that the thousands of cylinders in the service of our customers represent a tremendous investment and that when they are not returned promptly, we must purchase additional ones to replace them, in order to fill our orders.

Ordinarily, cylinders are returned within 90 days and if you look up the invoice on the cylinder in question, you will find that the terms included a rental charge of 50¢ per month after the first 120 days.

We are citing this merely to show you the reasonableness of this charge and that according to the terms of sale, it is in order.
