







Deen using here at Acadia for a number of years. It originated here and has been in constant use with most satisfactory results. It has these advantages:

1. -- made of chain -- therefore is indestructable -never out of order such as the nets that
constantly wear out and need repairing.

2. makes the basket wery stable.

3. against the white backboard- gives the player a vision of rather a large basket.

4. never any mistake about a basket being made-there is a slight pause of the ball as it goes
thru--- chains slide apart and ball drops.
