Dear Chancellor Malott,

I was perfectly aware of the fact that it would be impossible to charge any additional fees for the activity ticket. But I was not quite clear as to why there could not be a re-evaluation of the ticket distribution -- a cut of 5¢ here and there and the addition of a small amount to recreation and intramurals. This addition would give the students something that they're not getting and something that they need badly.

A check on the gate attendance of some of the activities that they are now paying for would doubtless reveal a small interest in the particular activities. Since the state is unable to make any contribution toward recreation fixtures here, it does not seem that even a small sum would be unwelcome in halting deterioration in the equipment of the physical education department. At the rate they're deteriorating, we will have no handball courts or tennis backstops that will hold together much longer. Even treating it in a palliative way is better than ignoring it entirely.
