By making each Director answerable to the Athletic Board for his own sport, there seems little reason to blame someone else for the failure of a football team to win its games. Someone has very aptly said, "When the football coach wins, he is a great fellow and everybody wants an increase in salary for him; but when the team loses, there must be interference with him, else he would have won."

This certainly has not been the attitude of Coaches Lindsey and Getto who have stated that they and the members of the squad have received every possible cooperation. Coach Lindsey has stated that he will suggest the appointment of two additional football coaches and the addition to our football schedule of "B" Varsity games. This would mean an added expenditure of from \$4,000.00 to \$6,000.00 next year to carry on this program.

After all, the major part of our income is from football. A well-rounded football schedule with an adequate coaching staff is worthy of careful consideration.
