Your second and most welcome "Rebounds" arrived yesterday causing me to realize my good intentions to write you, soon after the first, were still only intentions.

It is needless to say that I enjoy reading of the Boys and of your experiences. Anyone of us would be something other than a jayhawk if we didn't read Rebounds from cover to cover.

I appreciate Dick Harris' having you put me on your mailing list and I agree with Dick when he said in his last letter, "Dr. Allen deserves the Bronze Star for his efforts in writing to the Boys overseas." I realize Stars aren't issued to civilians but if thanks and appreciation will help in certain you are in for your share.

Miss Radar asked for overseas duty and was shipped out to a P.O.E. However when the war ended in Europe she was still in the U.S. & has now been put in a replacement pool at Ft. Dix, N.J. She enjoyed the first copy of Rebounds as much as I did & said to send you her best. She & her crew have helped my leg immeasurably.

Alice & I are beginning to think of leaving Colorado just as the weather is beginning to get livable. The medical Board recommended Permanent & limited Duty for me today. Now, I'm sweating out orders from Washington. They may retire me, or assign me to duty. If it is duty, I'll probably draw ROTC duty, as a Colonel from Omaha interviewed me with that in mind last Saturday. Regardless, we should be in Lawrence in a few weeks. (Kansas still looks the best to me after Africa, Italy & half the states of the 48.)

Thanks again for remembering me. I certainly enjoyed seeing about half of the home basketball games last season. I hadn't seen a game for three years and that's too long for a Kansan.

Dear Doctor Allen,

I've just received the May edition of Jayhawk Rebounds and have thrilled anew to your excellent description of that March night. Bill Johnson made his miraculous last minute appearance. I will always remember it as one of the most exciting evenings of the host we've had in Hoch auditorium.

Arrival of your Rebounds certainly provides one of the mail highlights of the month. Seems grand to hear about all the fellows we haven't been able to see in years. I think we'll have to dream up some kind of a special citation for you when this thing is all over!

Our main duty here at the Naval Supply Depot continues to be the same--to see that the Fleet gets the million and one things needed to keep the Fleet trains operating. However, we have just opened a new Recreation Center which is supposed to be the fanciest in the Southwest Pacific. We have five quonsets given over to a library, writing, reading and game rooms with indirect lighting, stained built-ins and other comforts of stateside duty. Our library has a newspaper section that really rivals the one at the University except that we're about five weeks late in getting them. We get all the leading papers from thruout the country and we keep up pretty well on the Kansas news thru the Kansas City Star and Topeka Daily Capital. I have general supervision of the Welfare & Recreation program and as you might guess I'm enjoying it thoroughly. We are completing an elaborate athletic field with three diamonds, basketball courts, handball, etc. Just had Johnnie Bradley added to our staff. He's from San Francisco and knows a lot of our boys--Ebling, Pralle, Wells, etc. having played against them in National AAU tournaments when he was with the Olympic Club.

Somewhere along the line my mailing address has gotten on your list with a slight error. I hate to wait the extra time while it bangs around these Pacific post offices, so I'll appreciate it immensely, Doc, if the succeeding ones can be sent here to NSD, Navy 3205. Hope you and Mrs. Allen are enjoying a pleasant summer.
