To the Superintendent:

"Fitness Problems of 1943" is the theme of the two-day streamlined convention of the Central District Association of Health, Physical Education and Recreation which will meet in Kansas City, April 2 and 3.

"Fitness Problems" such as: mass feeding in schools, recreation programs for doorstep children, the value of "the Grid," and meeting the standards of a good health and physical education program as outlined by the Victory Corps, will be discussed in this workshop conference.

Key speakers of the conference will be John B. Kelly, a member of the Federal Office of Defense, Health, and Welfare Services who will give the latest government information on improving the nation's physical fitness; Jay B. Nash, president of the national organization of Health, Physical Education and Recreation and an authority on solving health problems; John L. Bracken, chairman of the Commission who prepared "Health in Schools;" and Edward Haislet, Lt., U.S.N.R., assistant athletic director of the United States Navy.

This is a convention for civic leaders, educational leaders, school administrators, classroom teachers, nurses, physical education instructors, and college students. It is a convention to which every school system should send representatives.
