Dear Dr. Allen:

Thanks very much for sending me Clyde McBride's column. I hadn't seen it.

When Mark Cox's article was accepted, I suggested that we ought to get that story of yours, which we had been corresponding about, and run the two on facing pages. However, Mr. Gingrich felt that the war had depreciated sports so much that we shouldn't give basketball that much space. Hence the one-sided job.

Evidently there was a real controversy available, and I certainly regret that we did not present both sides of the picture.

I imagine Cox got most of his material from Edwards, since he was publicity man at Missouri, which probably accounts for everything.

When the idea of the double-spread was turned down, I did not followup your suggested piece. That is, however, the way I think the thing should have been handled, and it would have made a good set-up.

MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

COMMUNITY CHEST

AUGUST 24, 1943

Minutes of the last board meeting were read and approved.

On the recommendation of Ruben Fox, Chairman, Budget and Finance Committee, motion was made by Davidson, seconded by Eby, that the committee's action in approving and authorizing payments of member agency allotments from April 1st through October be accepted. Motion carried.

President Aszman read a report of the Budget and Finance Committee recommending the agencies and amounts for approval in next year's Community Chest. Copy of the report attached. On motion by Davidson, seconded by Mrs. Six, the report of the Budget and Finance Committee was accepted by the Board.

On motion by Woestemeyer, seconded by Eby, the Board went on record instructing the treasurer to invest \$1,000.00 of chest funds during the Third War Finance Campaign in September.

President Aszman expressed the appreciation of board members to Chairman Fox and other members of his Finance Committee for their thorough work in analyzing the reports and needs of the agency members.

On motion by Woestemeyer, seconded by Mrs. Dodds, the Chest Board went on record cooperating fully with the National War Fund, Inc. in the joint Chest-War Fund Campaign and in order to facilitate matters, the Chest Executive Committee, composed of the officers, be authorized to act for the Chest Board in working with the general campaign organization.

On motion by Mrs. Six, seconded by Fox, the Board unanimously approved the appointment of Fritz Elvig as general chairman of the joint Chest-War Fund Campaign in October.

Dear Sir:

On August 23, 1943, the Budget Committee of the Community Chest met at the Chamber of Commerce for the purpose of considering the applications for entry in the Community Chest for the year 1943-1944. After the consideration of the applications, the Budget Committee recommends to the Board of Directors that the following organizations be included in the Community Chest budget for the amounts shown opposite their names:

Boy Scouts	\$ 1,500.00
Joint Christian Council (Formerly Girl Reserves and Hi-Y)	275.00
Girl Scouts	700.00
K.U. Y.M.C.A.	950.00
K.U. Y.W.C.A.	900.00
Salvation Army	2,798.00
Social Service League	700.00
4-H Club	300.00
Total	<u>\$ 8,123.00</u>

The above total of \$8,123.00 does not include the items of shrinkage, campaign costs, or administrative costs, and your committee suggests that these remain the same as last year which was \$1,700.00 for all three items, being divided as follows:

Shrinkage	\$600.00
Campaign Costs	500.00
Administrative Costs	600.00

Including all items listed above the total amount recommended is \$9,848.00.

It is also recommended to the Board by the Budget Committee that since there will be approximately \$1,900.00 left in the Chest Fund as a carry-over, that \$900.00 be applied as a part of the amount it is recommended for the budget as set out above, and that \$1,000.00 be left in reserve for future use.
