although their basketball worthies were being defeated by Engleman & Co. In that game the Jayhawk star scored 23 points and sank nine of 12 shots from the field of play.

Engleman, the blond breeze of Dr. F. C. Allen's latest Big Six title contingent, is challenging every conference scoring record. After four league games he was leading the marksmen with an average of 20 points a game in contrast to the 15.4 established in 1937 by Frank Groves of Kansas State.

He was averaging 8.25 field goals a contest. The record in that department is 6.4. He hadn't missed a free throw in the Jayhawks last two games.
