Dear Mr. Cohlmeyer:

I apologize for the delay in answering your good letter of the 15th instant. I have been out of town much of late on basketball trips.

I doubt that the courses in osteopathy would be given credit at the University of Kansas toward a degree in physical education. However, an examination of your transcript by the Advanced Standing Committee would determine how much of your credit could be transferred.

Our four-year curriculum in physical education leads to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Education. Students desiring to major in physical education are required to take 18 or more hours of Education and 30-40 hours of physical education. I am enclosing one of our bulletins so that you may study the curriculum.

Mone of the physical education courses are offered by extension. The following courses in our department, however, are offered by correspondence: Basketball for Men (2 hrs. credit), Football Coaching (2 hrs. credit), and Track and Field Athletics (2 hrs. credit).

I trust I have answered your questions, but if I can be of any further service to you, please call on me. I might suggest that you could secure work in physical education at the Summer Session, and am having one of the Summer Session bulletins sent to you.
