
I received your new book direct from the publisher yesterday and certainly want to thank you very much.

I have several things to ask you — We would like to wear our white jerseys as they are in much better shape than our purples —

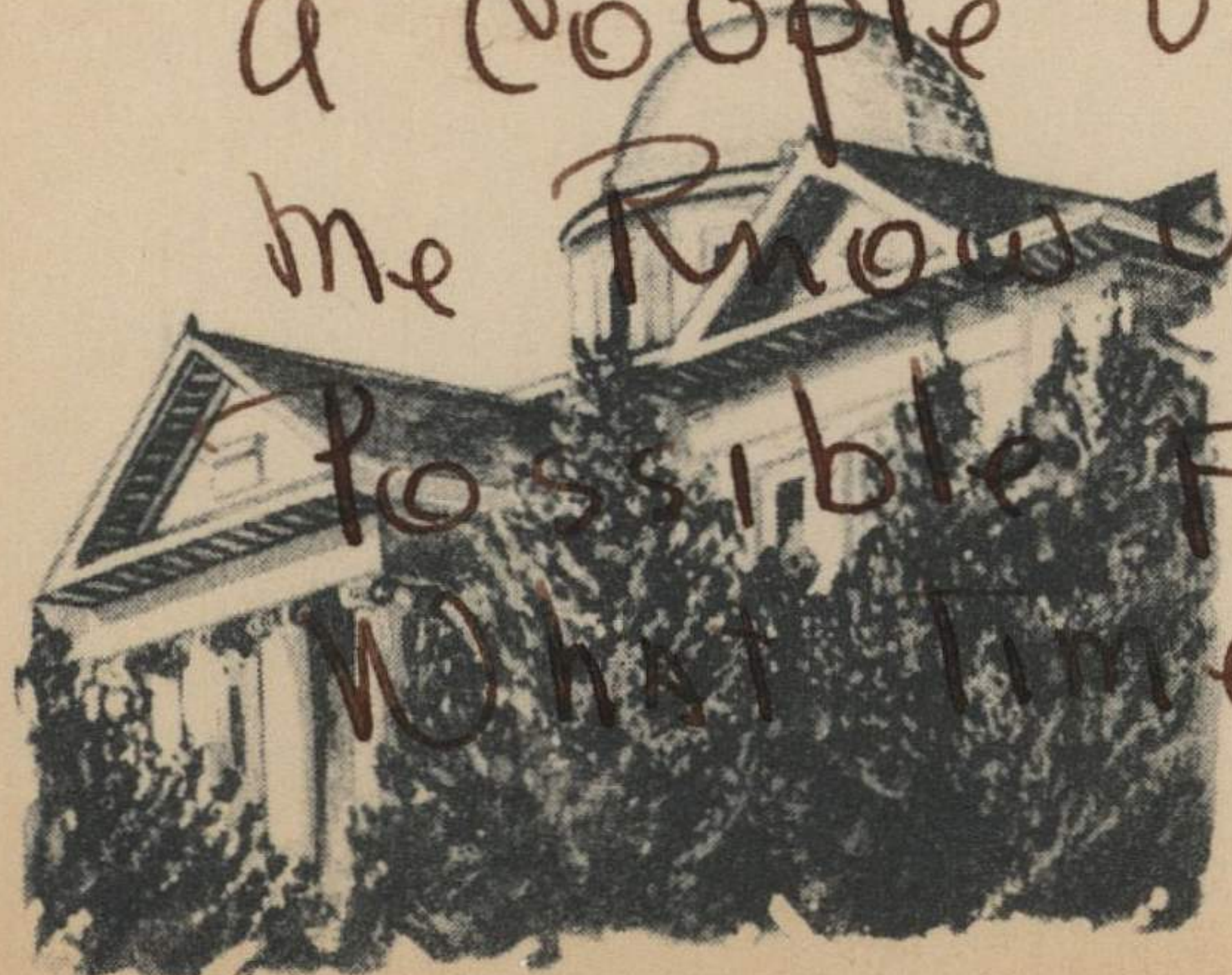
