Dear Mr. Henry:

I am sending you a copy of the minutes of the Finance Committee which was approved by the Athletic Board, as follows:

"That baseball as a conference sport be discontinued this spring, but that we have a baseball team to play local teams, such as Baker and Rockhurst, and conference teams whenever possible to do so without much expense."

From my conversation with you, I believe that you misinterpreted the motion. This leaves it open to play the Kansas Aggies and Missouri, according to the discussion while I was present at the Finance Committee meeting. You will recall that you left the Finance Committee conference early to attend a meeting in Topeka that day.

I did not hear from you or anyone else further concerning the meeting, so took it that the baseball team was to play a schedule of games. Am I correct in assuming that when you wrote all Big Six teams that Kansas would not play any conference schedule that this was hardly in conformance with the motion?

I have been corresponding with Don Faurot on the premise that we were to play a curtailed schedule. I will be glad to have a conference with you at your early convenience.
