Mr. Gwinn Henry has referred your letter to me for reply in regard to a baseball game.

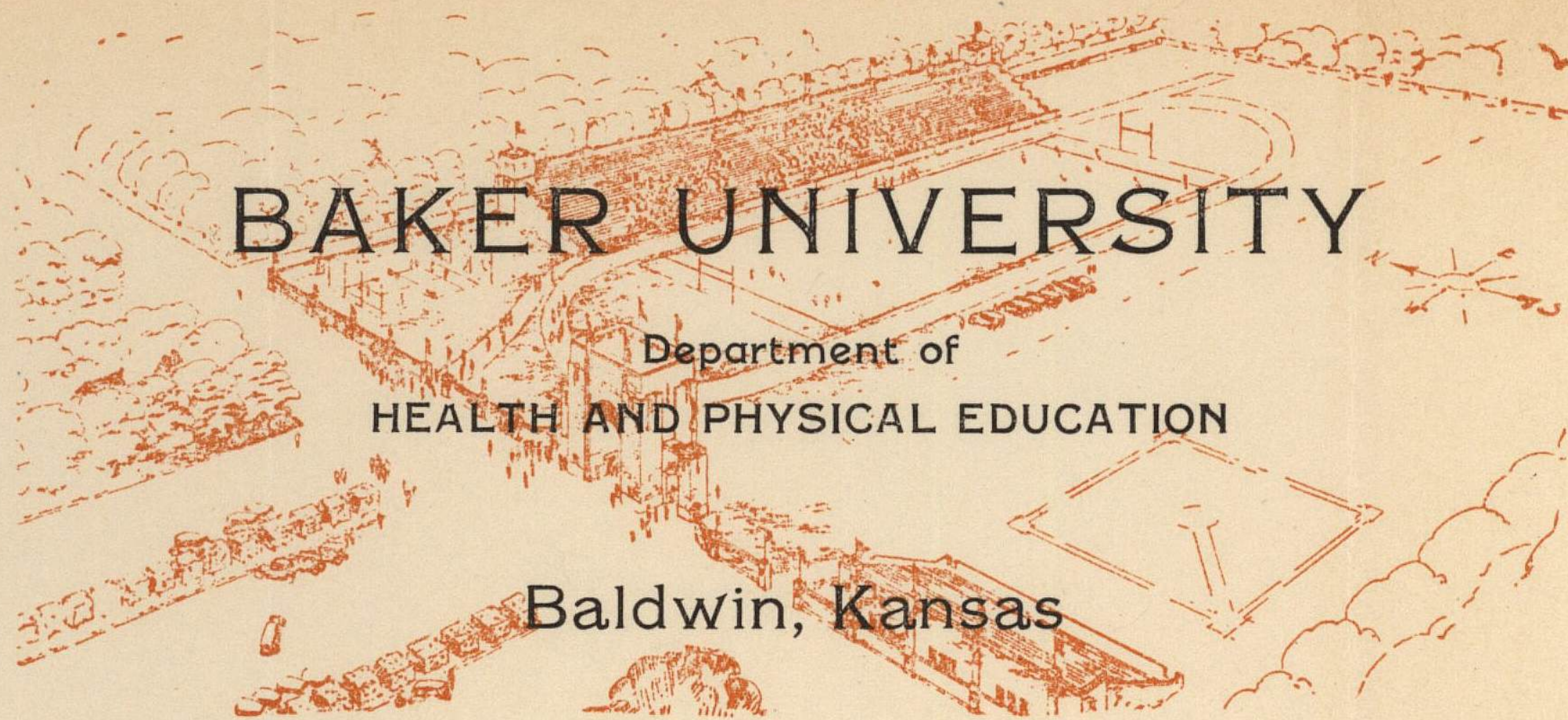
Most of our baseball players have either left the University or have chosen other schools where baseball has been more encouraged than here.

Dear Roy:

I just received your good letter and I regret that it is impossible for us to play Rockhurst this year.

The situation here is very similar, only a little worse, than the situation you find yourself in. Two years ago Ralph Conger, the freshman football coach, coached baseball and last year Mike Getto coached the Varsity. Neither of these football coaches had any baseball experience either as a player or as a coach, and as a consequence the caliber of baseball has suffered somewhat here in Lawrence.

Just at the close of basketball season they asked me to take baseball here. Nothing was done previously and as a consequence we have a tough schedule with the poorest prospects that we have ever had. We have only two fair pitchers and we have four Big-Six games on consecutive days on two different playing situations, so you can see that we are in for a slaughter. We open with Kansas State here on April 7 and 8 and those farmers pole long clouts I am told, so you see I am in for a tough season.

Also, Roy, we are permitted only 18 games and we have 16 scheduled in the Conference and two outside, taking up our full quota. However, I do thank you and hope that we can meet next year.

I would like very much to schedule a home and home game with Kansas University, realizing of course that your schedule is more or less filled and controlled by your conference.


