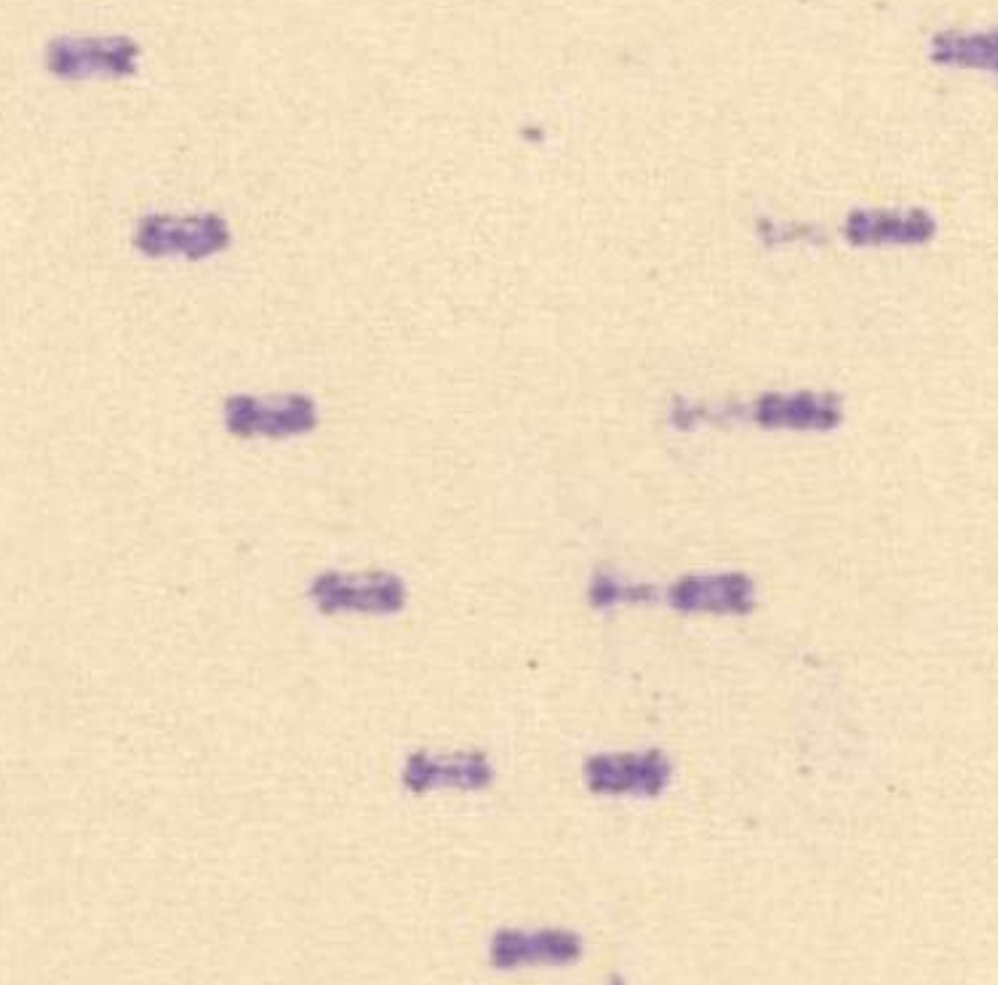


Stafford-Pratt continued

Great Bend-Liberal Game

First Quarter

Great Bend uses hook passes very artfully; drives down floor well. Liberal uses hook passes well. Morris of Liberal dribbled straight down side line over half the length of the court before passing.

Illustrate: Revolving of ense, or rolling triangle.

John Shelton of Great Bend uses intelligence in his play; being of small stature, he looks over the field before he tips the ball on a held ball or before he passes. W. Bledsoe is an excellent basket ball player. He sparks his team.

Norris of Liberal is using floor bounce well. Both Liberal and Great Bend play greatly improved game of fundamental basket ball. J. Shelton of Great Bend endeavored to shoot over opponent's head after being cautioned not to do so by both Great Bend rear offensive men.

When referee stands in front of free throw line endeavoring to attain proper position of opposing players, the player attempting the free throw should step outside his back half of the circle until the referee steps back, and then wald to the free throw line.

Second Quarter

Liberal doing too much dribbling in the back court rather than passing. Changing angles would be more advantageous than dribbling.

Great Bend could employ passing out ocassionally rather than too many spin shots. Liberal very clever ball handling. Palmer of Liberal good offense; proper position on defense, and good cell long shot on offense.

Great Bend could use one arm hook shot profitably under basket using cross step and whirl when closely pressed.

Simer of Great Bend used proper pivot in advancing down the floor. First time the pivot was used to full advantage in either game.

Half

Liberal coming up to meet the ball nicely on set play. On quick break down the floor, Palmer could have privoted and given the ball to his team mate nicely, but he hooked a pass and was blocked by the Great Bend defensive man on the floor. The pass was too high on Great Bend. PASS AT THE WAIST LINE AND NOT UP AT THE FACE besides the player receiving the ball was not expecting to receive it.
