John Shelton is very clever in evading opponent in making pass under difficult situation. He uses his shoulder legitimately to keep an aggressive player away until he can make a pass.

Fourth Quarter

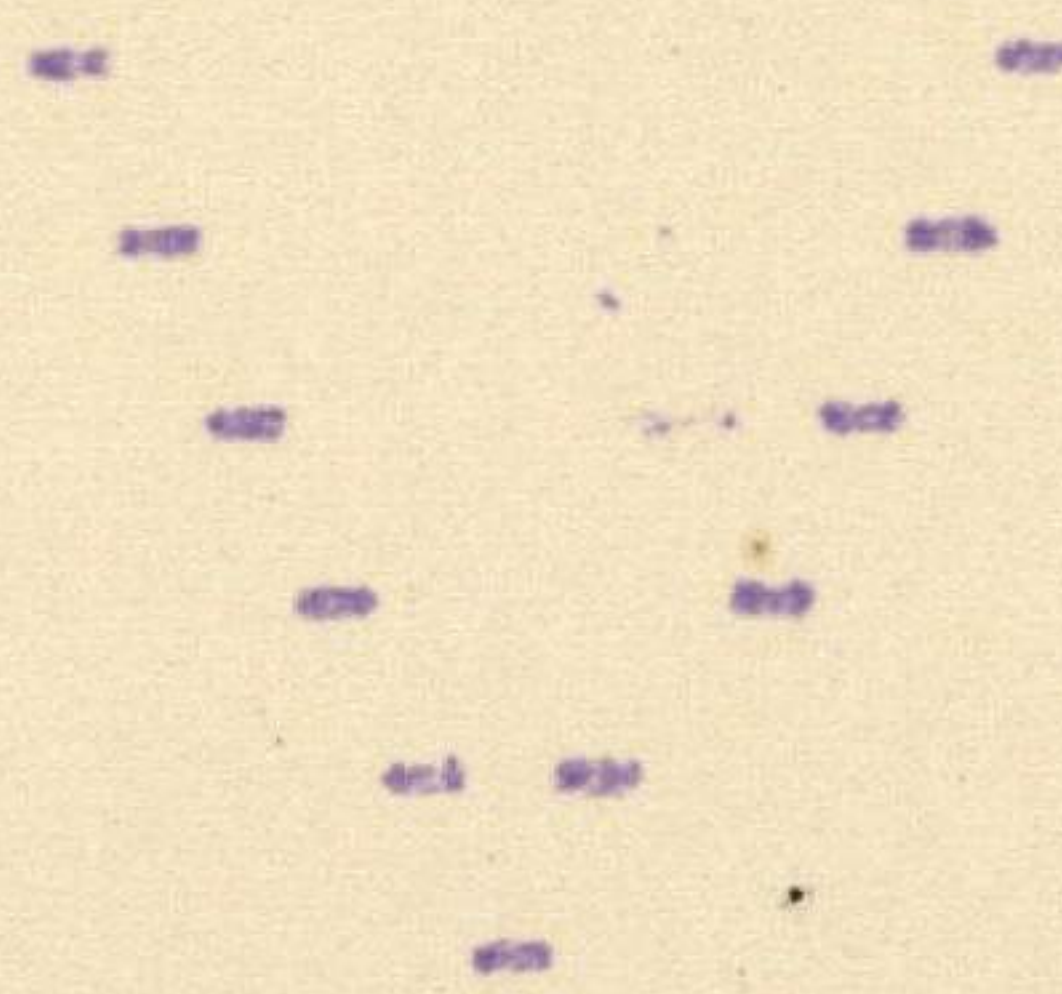
Show offensive play against team using zone defense. Nice pivoting by Simer of Great Bend.

Illustrate: pivot and foot movement after pivot.

When referee steps in to hold ball, free thrower should step out of circle for relaxation and then back into the circle. Shelton of Great Bend passed ball to Bledsoe right under the basket when he should have attempted to shoot because his distance was only 8 feet then Bledsoe could have rebounded the ball. As it was the ball was passes out of bounds, Bledsoe expecting Shelton to shoot.

Again Shelton passed the ball to Bledsoe when he should have shot. When players are close to the basket they should shoot rather than to make a short pass when all men are covered and when the players are expecting him to shoot, rather than to pass in that play situation.

Great Bend does not take advantage of the breaks after recovering the ball off the back board; they hesitate and form their offense slowly allowing Liberal to get back on defense.



Larned-Kinsley game

First Quarter

Kinsley pivots well, moving the ball around at variable angles.

Larned also using fundamental plays, pass in and out. Good work on the part of Rosner, bringing the ball out from congested area into a play situation so that a shot could be taken.

Heinz cuts into the larned offensive area in nice shape. He also pivots well.

Good pass into the offensive area on Kinsley.

On the offense, Larned on a quick break with three men down, all three men drove straight down the floor rather than criss-cross. Rosner holds the ball too long, after driving down the floor on a quick break. He should pass the ball, and cut, opening up avenues on the offense.

Second Quarter

When the left guard on offense has the ball, the right forward on offense should cut across diagonally toward the free throw circle to meet the hook pass delivered from the left guard. Then the right guard on the offense would be in a good position to swing around toward the basket, receiving a pass from the offensive right guard, after the right forward pivots,
