

Dodge City-Garden City continued

Second Quarter

Dodge City forwards coming to meet pass from guards gives the offense a decided advance over the stationary forward who tries to receive a pass from a guard. Evans of Dodge City receiving a pass, dribbles, swings around across basket for a shot, shows good fundamental coaching. If he is closely guarded he can pivot and pass back to either one of the guards who moved to an unguarded spot and receive the pass and shoot for the basket while they are temporarily unguarded. After recovering the ball under the basket, Evans drives out in the open then passes.

Garden City using good fundamentals in dribbling in the offensive area and then pivoting, passes out before the fellow who shoots, thereby providing opportunities that would not present themselves otherwise.

When Dodge City shoots a one hand hook shot they get in a little too close to the end line.

Half

Evans of Dodge City swing dribbles from his forward position in toward the basket drawing his guard towards the end, then passes out to Burnett who shoots a nice field goal for a basket. This play of Evans took the attention off Burnett's guard and Burnett had an opportunity to shoot a shot unmolested and it was good.

Garden City bounce passed the ball down the side line to a man in the corner and then the forward, instead of swinging on into the court and making possible a shooting area, again passed out toward the side line. This triangular offensive worked toward the side line to much rather than toward the court. It might be possible to drive a wedge 7-10 feet in the Dodge City defense. A pivot then with a pass backward would do the job.

Illustrate

Scott dribbles toward the end line and then shoots a one handed shot. He should pass out when he gets in that deep.
