Dear Dr. Allen:

Mr. Edward D. Hansen of Lawrence, Kansas, informs us that arrangements have been made with you to supervise, on May 13, 1943, his examination in Basketball recently completed with us through Correspondence Study. We are enclosing the questions, which you will kindly hold and present to him at the time set for the examination. If you are not personally acquainted with the student, please require proper identification. Identification may be through a mutual acquaintance or through such credentials as would seem satisfactory if you were arranging to cash a check or draft for a substantial sum. Letters from this department addressed to the student should not, in themselves, be considered sufficient for identification.

The examination is to be given under the following regulations:

1. The student will answer the questions without reference to any books, manuscripts, or notes whatever.

III. The umpire has the same authority in a basketball game as does the referee. It formerly was stated in the rules that the umpire did not have all the authority that the referee had. For instance, the umpire formerly could not call an out-of-bounds play. Now he can. With our present system of dual officiating both the umpire and referee have the authority.

IV. It is not necessary that the umpire or referee notify a player when he has made three personal fouls. If the captain of the team would ask the referee or umpire to find out for him the number of fouls on a player the referee or umpire would probably do it. The officials, however, are not obliged to perform this service.

V. It is necessary for the referee to decide in favor of the smaller score when it is proved that players of the other team are ineligible for competition. It would be necessary for the referee to decide in favor of the longer playing time where there are two clocks giving time. If there is a discrepancy between the two the referee must decide in favor of the longer playing time.



This very situation arose this past season in Hoch Auditorium. The two clocks were different and the game was continued by the clock that showed the longest playing time remaining.

VI. a player of either team may legally call time out only when they are in possession of the ball. A captain of a team is usually the one who calls time out.  
*Or when ball is dead*

VII. A legal dribble is one in which the player bounces the ball on the floor with one hand. An illegal dribble would be one in which both hands were used to dribble the ball or when a player would juggle the ball in his hand at the top of the bounce. A player cannot be dribbling along, come close to an opponent, loop the ball over the opponents head and continue dribbling.

Illegal starting of the dribble is when a player takes a short step with the ball in his hands before he actually bounces the ball to the floor. A legal starting of the dribble would be when the player actually bounces the ball to the floor as he takes the first step.



VIII. Well, boys, tonight is the big night. We've been looking forward to this one for a long time, haven't we? You'll whip these boys tonight. I know you will because I know we've got a ball club here that is not 5 men each playing for himself but 5 men who work as one. We've gone over their ~~weak~~ and their strong points. You have all the advantage of good scouting. Now let's run over their team just a minute. They'll play a man-for-man defense so pass them to death. Keep them running. Take your time at the beginning of the game. Pass the ball around to test out their defense. Now when you're on defense you'll play a shifting zone and shift fast. Don't let that man with the ball open a second. Taylor is their star. He'll be number 66. He's tall and they'll put him on a post. He's deadly with either right or left hand off that post so keep him bottled. Don't let them pass in to him. If they do watch him. Charlie, you'll be playing the center slot in the defense so you'll be guarding him most of the time. Here is the thing to remember. He'll always



fake one way then shoot the other. For instance he'll feint to the left, then swing to the right shooting with his left hand. Or he might do it vice versa.

Don't fall for that fake. Let him feint one way, then you be waiting for him when he comes around.

You boys have been looking forward to this game for a long time. You're set to go. Everything says you should win, but remember this, all the dope is clear off on this game. If you're going to win it you're going to have to beat a good club.

Now, remember this. I probably want you to win this game as bad as you want to but let's do it fair and square. Don't start anything. If they get rough the referee will take care of them.

It's not whether you won or lost that I'm concerned with but how you played the game. Be sportsmen first.

Now let's go whip that team.



IX. 1. A three-game trip would probably cover the greater part of a week's time. The first and foremost responsibility of the coach not only to his players as students but to the school would be to see that they studied while on the trip.

2. Travelling is hard and tiring. The best accommodations available should be procured for the team. The coach should see to it that meals are eaten regularly.

3. Sight-seeing trips in strange cities are wonderful recreation for a team and one that all enjoy.

4. The serious business of basketball playing is not to be forgotten. The coach should see to it that an auditorium for short practice sessions be provided.

5. Players should be allowed to visit relatives on trips if such a visit will not inconvenience the team or interrupt the trip. The team and trip come first. If a visit with relatives can be arranged that is fine and good.

X. The benefits a coach might receive from his association with young men would be numerous. The joy or pleasure of knowing that you have taken a squad of boys, trained them to a point of excellence, taught them the game of basketball, taught them to live, work and play together and the thought



that through your work<sup>7.</sup> you have made of them better citizens would be a wonderful feeling.

✓ The coach's moral and intellectual equipment should be the best before he assumes the responsibilities of a coach. Players will respect a clean living, intelligent, family man as their coach.

The coach, if he is the right kind of coach, will be looked up to and respected by the community, the students and the team. The faculty might hold some ill-feeling against him because he is apt to receive the publicity of the school. He must work to decrease the animosity that might exist here.

✓ He must remember that he is also a member of the community in addition to being a member of the faculty. He should participate in local affairs.

To the students an athletic coach is probably the man most looked up to. The coach should endeavor to fulfill their faith and trust.

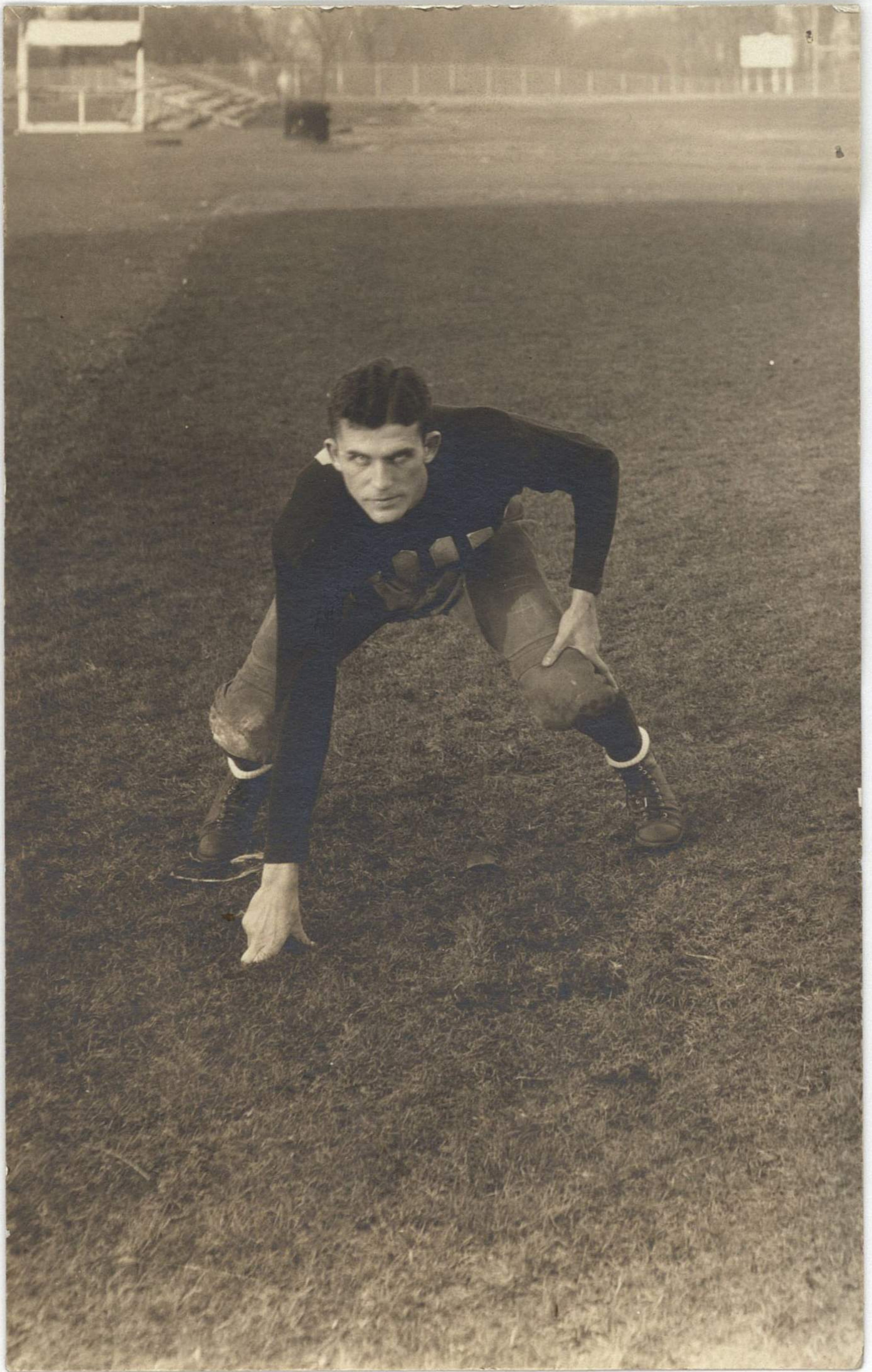

## ASSIGNMENT XV.

Officials and Officiating. See Rule Book.

REFERENCE: Better Basket Ball incorporating Technique, Tactics and Tales  
Spaulding's Official Basket Ball Guide for the current year.

## QUESTIONS:

1. What are some of the requisites of a good official?
2. What can you say of the coach's duty to the referee?
3. Write up a playing contract for two teams. Designate guarantee, the time of agreement upon officials, the agreement on eligibility, the starting time of the game, and state the rules under which the teams shall play, and state any other necessary details that would make a bona fide agreement between two schools.
4. Diagram a regulation basketball court, showing the dimensions of the playing court, the free area necessary around the court, the height of the basket from the floor, the distance of the basket from the back-board, the size of the basket (diameter in inches), the free throw circles and lanes, and the size of the center circle.
5. State size and weight of ball. Is there an official ball by a trade name required for the game? If so what?
6. State in detail what is required of a substitute before he goes on the court to enter play. Give in detail what is required of each officer of the game in this situation.
7. Two players of the same team have the same numbers on their jerseys. This fact is not discovered until after the game starts. What should be the ruling of the referee when objection by the opponents is made to him about these numbers? Note: There was no deception involved. Two sets of uniforms were in use and the same numbers came from the different sets ordered in different years. The offending team claimed that this was merely an accident.
8. Player of Team A, in a fit of coughing, leaves the playing floor to expectorate. The captain of Team B. makes objection to this move to the referee and insists on a foul being called on Team A, under the rules. What decision should be made in this case? Give reasons.

11. Three members of the same team committed fouls, simultaneously, on the same player who was in the act of trying for a goal. The first member of the team charged into the opponent who had the ball; the second member struck the opponent's arm in an endeavor to get at the ball; the third man, coming after the ball, charged in using unnecessary roughness. How many free throws should be awarded?
12. Does the umpire have authority to call an out-of-bounds play?
13. Shall the referee, the umpire, or the scorer notify the player when he has made three personal fouls? Why?
14. A player of team A jumps upon the shoulder of one of his teammates. The ball is quickly passed to him in this position and he scores. What should be the referee's decision in this case?
