#### 17 ALLOTMENTS TO STATES

18 SEC. 31. From the sums made available under sections  
19 11 and 21 of this Act the United States Commissioner of  
20 Education (hereinafter called the Commissioner) shall ap-  
21 portion annually to each State an amount which bears the  
22 same ratio to the total amount made available as the ratio  
23 of the number of children five to twenty years of age, in-
