Dear Dr. Allen,

I have just received news from the Jayhawk Nursery that it is still being operated under favorable conditions. For "special reasons" (which I suppose may have something to do with defense) it is to be moved from near Rugby to Barnstaple, in Devon. When located there it will take children from the "much bombed city of Plymouth". This might be a helpful point for you with the Committee for Plymouth is certainly within the robot-bomb area.

I hope you have had some success. I feel very guilty at being away while the possibility of support for the Nursery is up for consideration but I am very grateful to you for your help. I think, as I said before, that if the Committee is willing to include support for the Nursery it would be very wise to have it stated: "for foreign relief including the Jayhawk Nursery" or some such phrasing.

It seems to me that the renewal of bombing of England together with the new location of the Nursery make it very reasonable for us to support it while longer
