

4. We recommend that beginning in the fall of 1940 the College Office prepare for use on the enrollment floor a leaflet giving information about the training of teachers done in the College. (The purpose of this leaflet would be to combat the common view that those who wish to prepare to teach in this state cannot receive this preparation by remaining in the College. The leaflet should point out the relationships existing between the College and the School of Education and make clear that College students are eligible to enroll in all courses required by the State Board of Education and to receive the University Teacher's Diploma.)
5. Finally, we recommend that the matter of the proper training of teachers in the College be placed in the hands of a standing committee, and that this committee work with representatives of the School of Education in dealing with the problems common to the two divisions. (In offering this proposal we are mindful of the danger of having too many committees, but we feel that unless some group is charged with the responsibility of keeping the question of the training of teachers alive, it will drop back into the obscurity from which it has temporarily emerged.)
