Dear Mr. Allen:

Again I come to you for help. I just talked to Supt. Hazel about my certificate, or rather, about what I'd need to do to get a Michigan certificate. The only thing I lack is one semester hour of practice teaching. Supt. Hazel asked me how much time I spent in getting my 4 hours of practice teaching at K.U. As I remember, we taught 2 days a week, either taught or observed on Friday, plus one hour a week for practice teachers meetings with Miss Dunkel making a total of 4 hours per week for 2 semesters. Is this not right?

Mr. Hazel suggests that I have you or Miss Hoover write a statement to Lawrence J. Tidrick, Asst. Supt. of Public Instruction, Lansing, Michigan, and tell him how much time I spent in practice teaching. Mr. Hazel would also like you to mention the teaching I did in university classes during my last semester at K.U. He suggested that if it could be called supervised (Substitute or assistant) teaching that perhaps Michigan would allow the one semester hour of practice teaching that I need be taken care of with this university work.

You may wish to talk to Miss Hoover in regards to my practice teaching or the substitute work I did during her illness in 1938. Mr. Tidrick will not be in his office till Sept 23, so you will have plenty of time.

I'm not worrying about my job here; for Mr. Hazel says my job goes on this year regardless of certificate or not; however, I can't see myself spending next summer taking practice teaching. K. U. is going to exempt me from further practice

~~practice~~ teaching and allow me to get my Master's Degree next summer provided I can work in a Chemistry course this winter. If I can't get a course at Western State Teacher's College in Kalamazoo that N.Y.U. will accept, I'll take a correspondence course then an exemption exam next June at N.Y.U. - That doesn't worry me now - Practice Teaching is my bug-a-boo.

We finally got our schedule worked out for the Senior High classes. We'll have every student from grade 5 on up at least once a week and a few so high students twice a week. My schedule is light in comparison to the past 2 years in Salina.

I'm going out to the Kellogg Foundation Camp this eve & spend the week end. The camping program is to start next week. None of our students will go till 4 weeks from now. 2 other schools are participating so we must take our turns.

I haven't been busy this week at all for I had no classes except 2 on Mon P.M. and 3 yesterday. However, I'll go in full swing now. I hope the weather is nice. This week has been cold & rainy. Flies & mosquitoes have been almost unbearable.

I must close. I'll appreciate very much any statement you might send Mr. Tidrick in regards to my practice teaching. Thanking you kindly, I remain




Dear Fog:


