Dear Chancellor Lindley:

Mrs. L. H. Flint called me Saturday morning to ask if I would do what I could to remedy the traffic congestion that forms at 16th and Louisiana streets on days when we have football games.

Feeling that I had nothing to do with this matter I referred her to Director of Athletics Quinn Henry. Then she said, "I have tried everybody else and that is why I am bothering you." After this statement by her I felt it was a joint responsibility of the University and the city to handle this situation. I called the Chief of Police and he said that he would take care of it. I advised that police placards directing the flow of traffic to the new concrete approach to the University would be helpful. Driving into blind streets is a very vexing experience for our visitors.

I assure you I have no desire to participate in this problem beyond trying to keep everybody happy.
