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PHYSICAL EDUCATION (Women)

All women who entered the University in September 1942 and thereafter, are required to enroll in Physical Education unless they have already earned two semesters' credit. The work is optional for all other women, and students may earn a maximum of four hours of credit.

Women taking this work must enroll for the entire semester, listing the course on the enrollment card as Physical Education, and giving the hour and the day selected. The enrollment of each candidate for the Bachelor of Science degree in Education must be approved by an Education Advisor.

Graduate students in Education will report to the head of the Department of Education immediately after receiving enrollment materials from the Graduate Office.

Each student entering the Teacher Training Program should obtain the approval of an Education Advisor on his professional program.

All assignments to Supervised Teaching sections are made by the Principal of the University High School. Supervised teaching on the secondary school level is restricted to candidates whose credentials have been approved by the Office of the Dean of the School of Education.

- Courses numbered 50-99 are open to Juniors and Seniors.
- Courses numbered 100-199 are open to Juniors, Seniors, and Graduates.
- Courses numbered 200-299 are open to Seniors and Graduates.

INFORMATION ON THE TEACHER TRAINING PROGRAM

Information about the Teacher Training Program may be obtained from the office of the School of Education.

Candidates will begin their work with P50 and A50, then elect any two of the following three courses; H64, S52, and E50. These courses constitute the Fundamentals Group. In addition to these courses, candidates will take the teaching methods course and supervised teach-

ing in their major subject, or in their minor. Students in the School of Education will elect nine additional hours of Education courses; students in other schools of the University will elect three hours.

Teacher Training Program requirements include, in addition to the Education courses listed above; General Psychology, 5 hours; Social Studies, 5 hours; Fundamentals of Speech, 2 hours; a major and a minor.

Upon completion of the Teacher Training Program, a Student will have met the requirements for a three-year-renewable-for-life certificate good in any Kansas School. This certificate will be granted by the State Board of Education upon application.

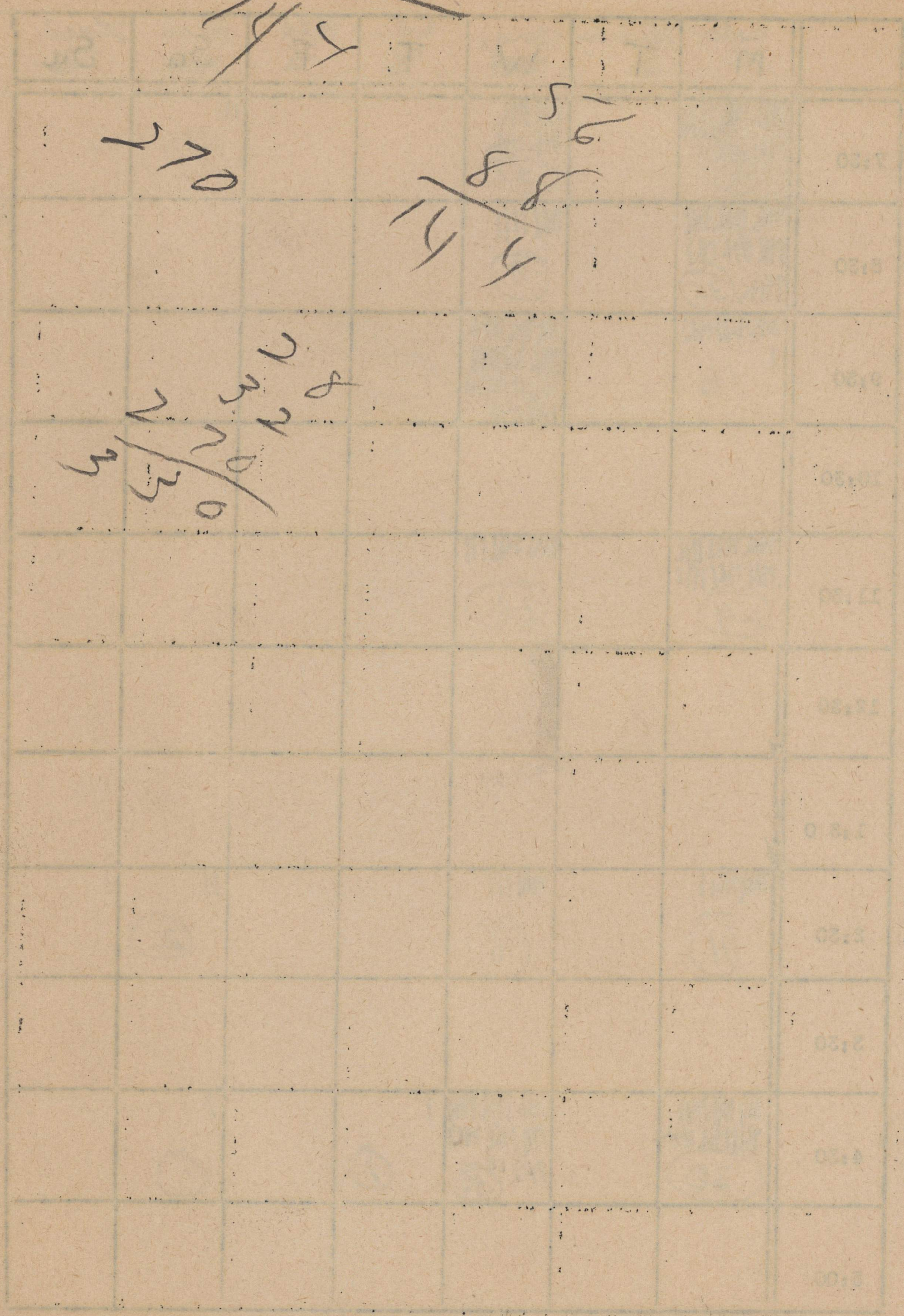
