

ing in their major subject, or in their minor. Students in the School of Education will elect nine additional hours of Education courses; students in other schools of the University will elect three hours.

Teacher Training Program requirements include, in addition to the Education courses listed above; General Psychology, 5 hours; Social Studies, 5 hours; Fundamentals of Speech, 2 hours; a major and a minor.

Upon completion of the Teacher Training Program, a Student will have met the requirements for a three-year-renewable-for-life certificate good in any Kansas School. This certificate will be granted by the State Board of Education upon application.

INFORMATION ON ENROLLMENT

The School of Education enrollment will be held in Robinson Gymnasium, on Monday and Tuesday, November 1 and 2, 1943. Enrollment will follow the College letter system. The enrollment of each candidate for the Bachelor of Science degree in Education must be approved by an Education Advisor. Graduate students in Education will report to the head of the Department of Education immediately after receiving enrollment material from the Graduate Office. Each student entering the Teacher Training Program should obtain the approval of an Education Advisor on his professional program. All assignments to supervised teaching sections are made by the Principal of the University High School. Supervised teaching on the secondary school level is restricted to candidates whose credentials have been approved by the Office of the Dean of the School of Education.

Courses numbered 1-49 are open to Freshman and Sophomores.
 Courses numbered 50-99 are open to Juniors and Seniors.
 Courses numbered 100-199 are open to Masters, Teachers, and Graduates.
 Courses numbered 200-299 are open to Seniors and Graduates.
 Courses numbered 300-399 are open to Graduates only.

In column 8 of the schedule the schools in which each course gives credit are listed as follows: G = Graduate school; H = School of Business; I = School of Education; C = College of Liberal Arts and Sciences; F = School of Fine Arts; D = School of Dentistry; see Section II of the University Catalogue.

Abbreviations used in column 7: F = Fraser Hall; UHS = University High School; R = Robinson Gymnasium; FS = Frank Strong Hall.
