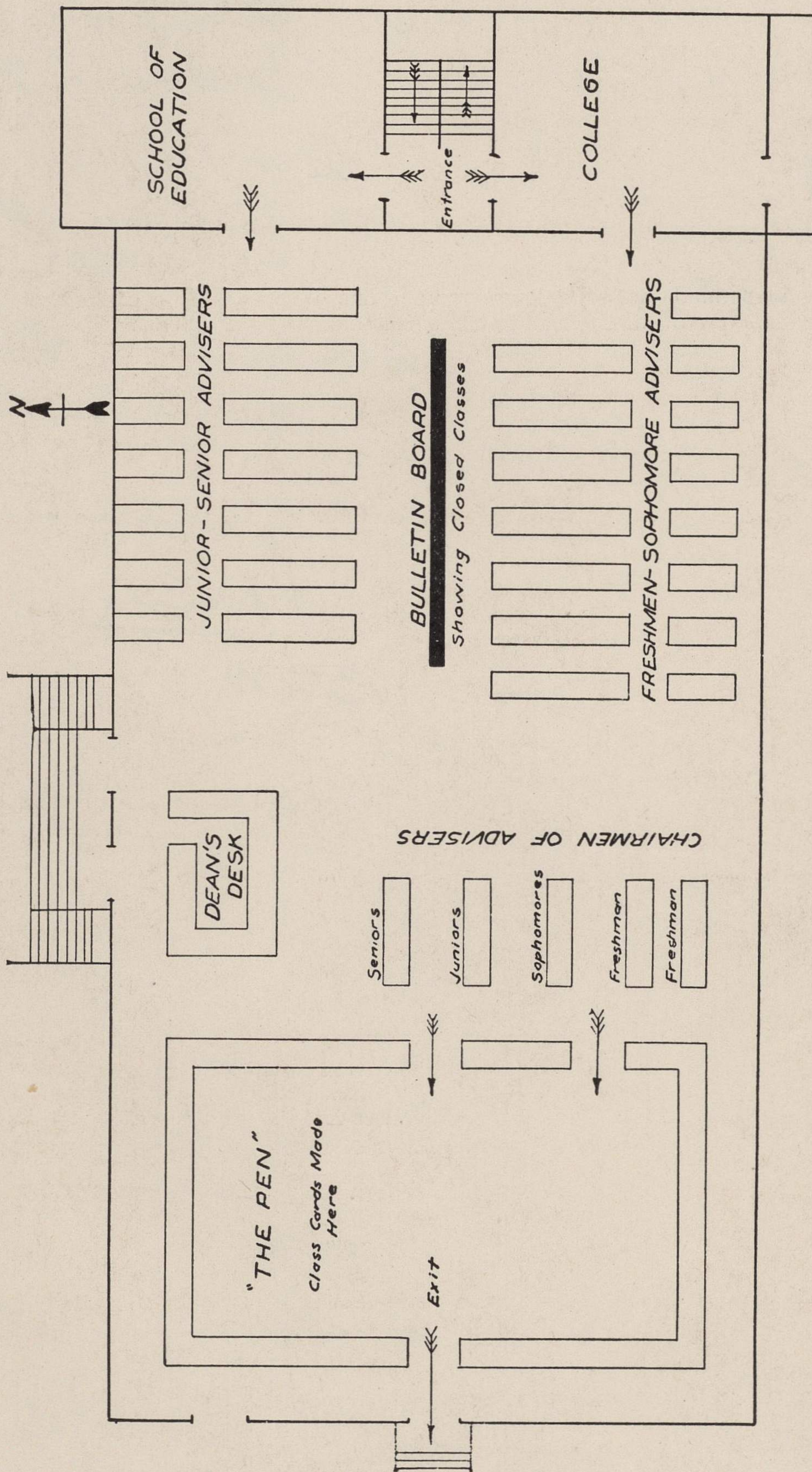

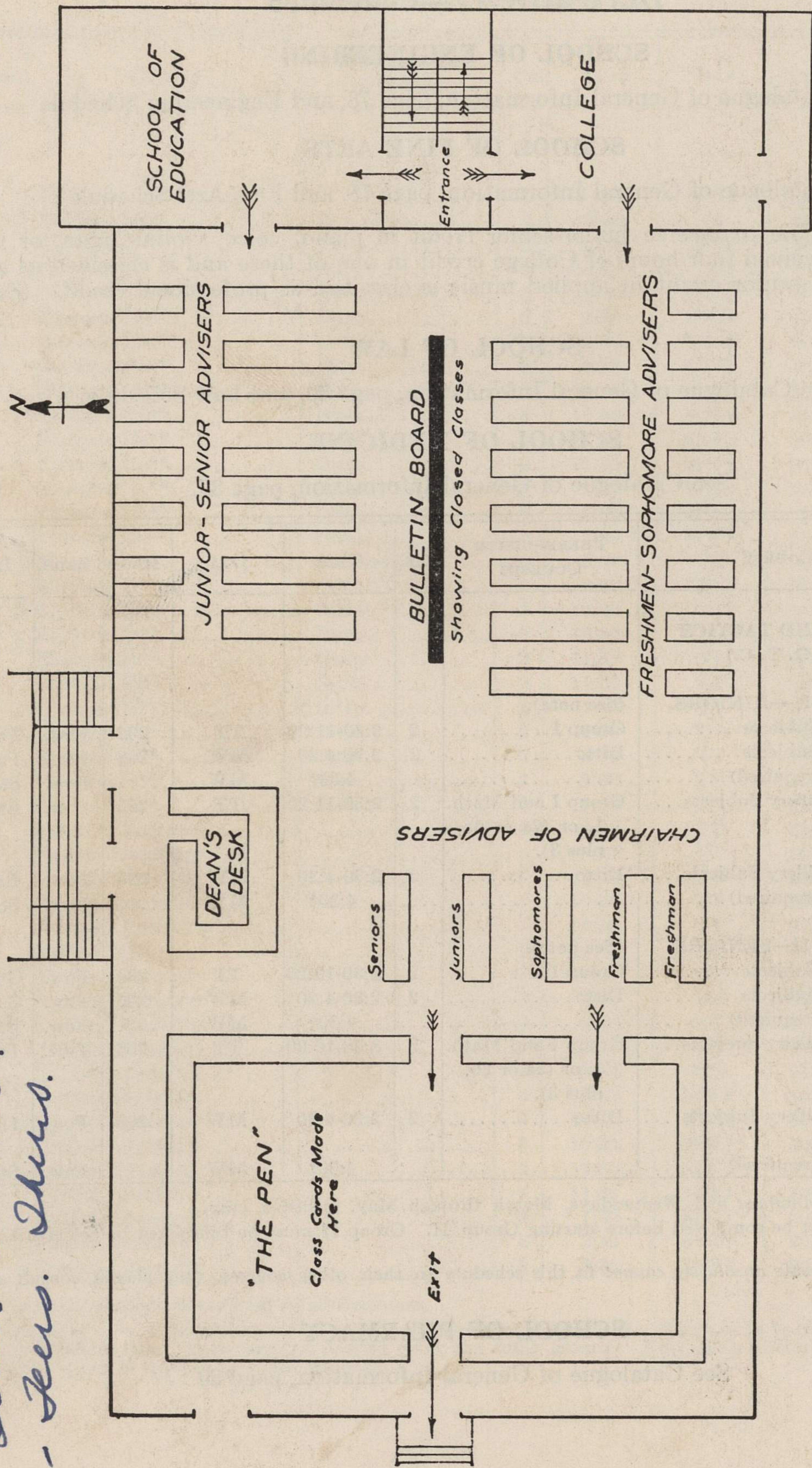

Candidates will begin their work with P50 and A50, then elect any two of the following three courses: H64, S52, and E50. This will constitute the Fundamentals Group. They will

take the teaching methods course and supervised teaching in their major subject, or in their minor. Students in the School of Education will elect nine additional hours of Education courses; students in other schools of the University will elect three hours.
