You and I have been personal friends for a long time and any administrative hiatus that may occur between one organization and another will not interfere with our personal friendship, I assure you, so far as I am concerned.

I am sending you a carbon copy of a letter that George Edwards wrote to Gwinn Henry, the Athletic Director here at the University, and sent a carbon copy to me. My reply to Edwards is also enclosed herewith.

I am sending the letters to you so that you can see that I have not withdrawn from my position in charging the N.C.A.A. Executive Committee and leaders with discrimination, lack of foresight, and intelligent administration - if not to say outright discrimination and petty manipulation.

I have not sent a copy of this correspondence to Major Griffith, St. John or Olsen, but the tone of my letter gives you a correct diagnosis of my attitude.
