The council looked upon this in a very friendly way. They did express a fear, however, that there might be a danger of the boys coming down and at times being left alone without supervision. In this way, they feared possible damage to property of the building, and naturally, they being responsible, expressed the hope that no great boy would ever be left alone in the building without supervision. I assured them that Mr. Strait who had had excellent training in physical education before coming to us was supervisor of physical education activities of the Granite Public School, and was very cognizant of the necessity of keeping youngsters under supervision at all times. I assured them that they need have no fear of Mr. Strait's leaving them in the building for one moment without supervision.

The committee reporting on this, including Messrs. Burger, Bell, Gustafson and Russell, were present, and if I can diagnose clearly, I believe they will make a very favorable report. Mr. Harold Fisher, city clerk who was formerly county superintendent of Douglas County, also had questions to ask and discuss, but I assure you they were friendly ones.
