The Department of Education has collected a number of tests in educational and mental measurements which have been assembled under the following twelve major heads:


Algebra and Geometry (and Trigonometry)

Mechanical Drawing, and Music)
Reading and Vocabulary
Science

These volumes constitute part of a permanent collection of test materials and because of the risks of damage and loss involved by use outside of the Library, we are asking the library authorities not to permit the removal of any one of these volumes from that building.
