Dear Dean Schwegler:

Mr. Raymond Swanson, a graduate student who is one of our majors in Physical Education, came in to see me the other day about his course for the second semester. You are probably familiar with his case, as he told me that he had consulted you.

As you doubtless know, he plans to enroll in Problems in Physical Education under Dr. Elbel, for 4 hours, in Principles of Community Recreation for 3 hours under Dr. Elbel, and he is now searching for an additional graduate course in Physical Education. He suggested that if we could secure the permission of Dean Stouffer for him to take 2 hours in Systematic Readings in Physical Education that this would solve his problem.

Inasmuch as the curriculum committee of the School of Education did not approve our course in Systematic Readings, I have hesitated to ask Dean Stouffer for any special permission. I am wondering if there is not a Reading course in Education which Mr. Swanson could take during the spring semester. I shall be very glad to have your advice and suggestions in the matter. I feel sure you will understand my hesitancy in asking Dean Stouffer to approve something that was not approved by the School of Education.
