I received your letter with reference to the Alumni Varsity game to be played November 26 in Lawrence.

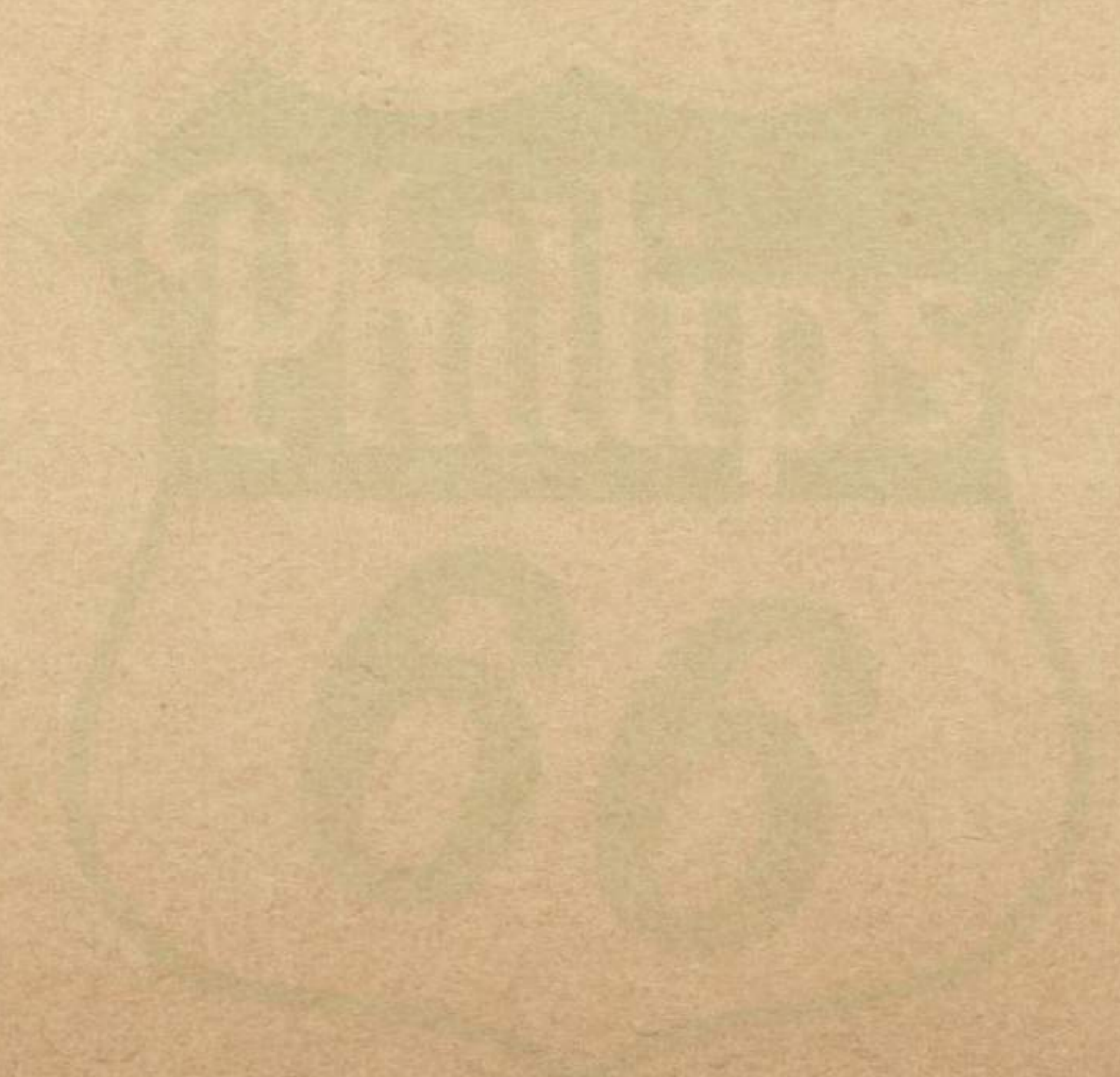

As you already know, Dan Partner and his wife are planning on attending the game with my wife and myself, and I would appreciate very much if you would get tickets for the Partners and my wife.

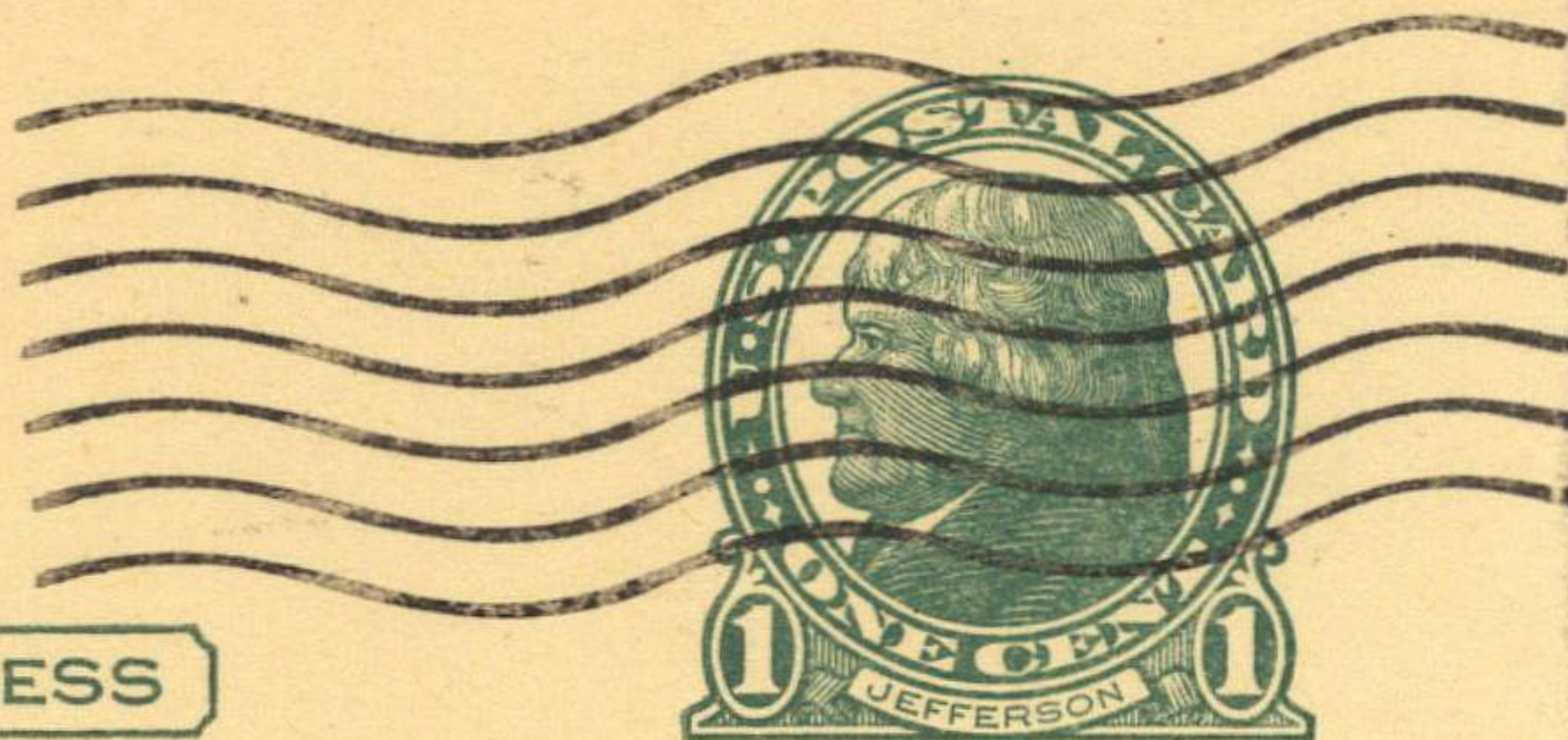
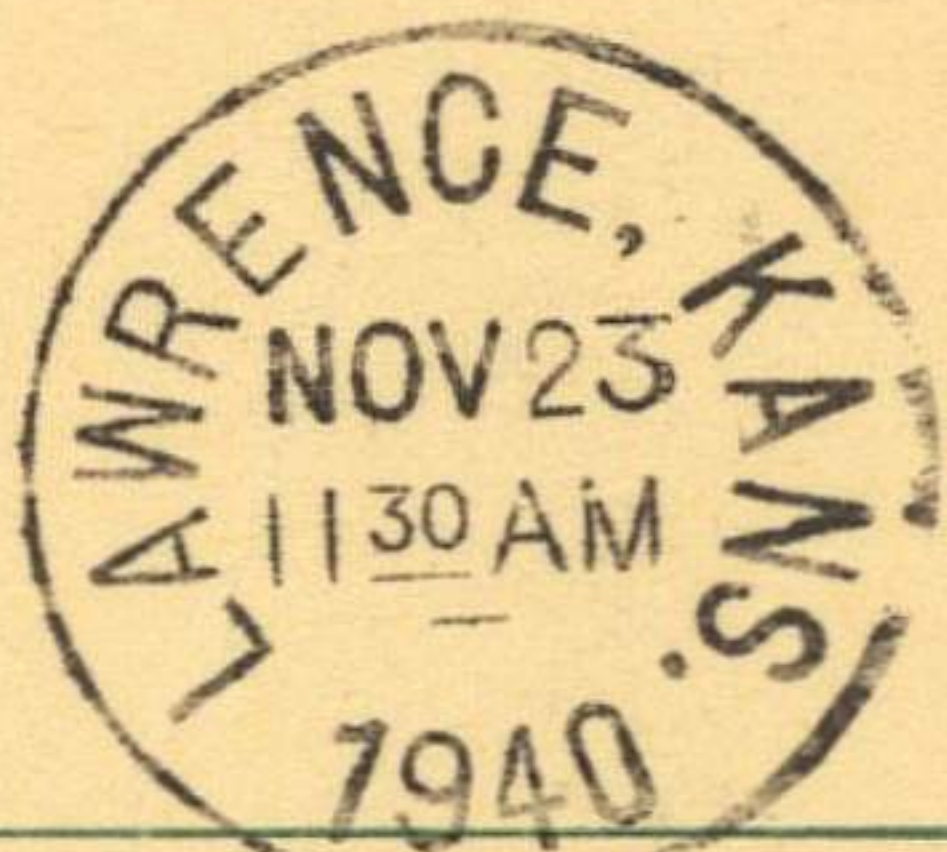

We have received the new ball sent us to replace the defective Reach ball, and also the used one which you state has been punctured too badly to be replaced.

In my opinion we did not get the wear out of this ball that we should have, and we feel we should be allowed something on it. Due to the fact that the ball ripped loose and was punctured shows there must have been a defect in the covering.

Several days ago I talked with Mr. Taft Talbot and he advised me that the Reach basketballs are guaranteed. We feel that if this type ball is guaranteed then the outer fabric should have been of better quality and the ball would not have been punctured. In that case we never got half the wear out of it and we feel some adjustment should be made, such as allowing us half price on a new ball.

Don't you think that is fair? We do.



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
