COACH ALLEN SUGGESTS AUDITORIUM BE USED FRIDAY NIGHT.

Facilities of the Arena Have Been Engaged by the Girl Scouts, However—Higs There Saturday.

Efforts to move the Missouri-Kansas basketball game, scheduled for Friday night, from Lawrence to the Municipal Auditorium floor here were stymied today because the arena already has been hired for that night.

Dr. F. C. Allen, coach at the University of Kansas, suggested the move at Lawrence today in an effort to accommodate the large crowd expected for the Big Six conference game which will have an important bearing on the 1940 title.

"If the K. U. and Big Six authorities would approve, I suggest the game be played in Kansas City Municipal Auditorium," Allen said. "Our auditorium will seat only 4,700 and I expect many fans to be turned away Friday night."

Coach George Edwards of Missouri said he would "be happy" to bring his Tigers to Kansas City for the clash.

"I doubt that arrangements can be made at this late date," Edwards said, "but if it is possible I would be very happy to play in Kansas City."

Allen was attempting to get the approval of the Kansas university and Big Six conference authorities today. The Girl Scouts have the arena booked for Friday night. On Saturday night there is the interscholastic basketball play-off between St. Louis and Kansas City high schools.
