

RANKING

An official's Ranking Numerical position on the list shall be determined by his Qualifying Score.

CLASSIFICATION

Officials shall be classed as "A", "B", or "C".

A minimum qualifying score shall be fixed for each classification annually by the Commissioner.

Class A computes in all 16 events - Total points 117
 Class B computes in 12 events - not in No. 7 Fearlessness, No. 8, Desirability, No. 10 Elapsed Time, and No. 12 Program Conferences - Total Points 92.
 Class C includes all others.

TABLE OF MINIMUMS FOR 1939

Class A - 80.0 points (based on at least 5 major college games)
 Class B - 45.0 " (based on at least 5 minor college games)
 Class C - No minimum for first year.

For Admission:

Eligible List - Class A - 80 points
 Class B - 45 points

GRADING

Officials shall be graded according to the following table of equivalents:

Qualifying Score of	90% - 100%	of possible points	EXCELLENT
"	"	80 - 90	VERY GOOD
"	"	70 - 80	GOOD
"	"	60 - 70	SATISFACTORY
"	"	50 - 60	FAIR
"	"	Less than 50%	POOR

An official's grading shall be determined by the following formulae:

For: Class A	$\frac{\text{Total Number of points earned} \times 100}{117}$	equals grade
Class B	$\frac{\text{Total Number of points earned} \times 100}{92}$	equals grade
Class C	No grading first year.	

CLASSIFICATION SETUP BEGINNING

SEPTEMBER 5, 1939

Class A

(a) Any official who has worked in a minimum of 5 games during the past three years shall be eligible for Class "A" Classification.
