Dear Dudley:

While I was in San Francisco I had expected to have a conference with you concerning your brother, Edward. I talked to John Bunn about him and John recommended him very highly. He told me that Edward was teaching at Kamehameha Boys School in Honolulu, T. H., and he was not sure whether he would be interested in a position at the University of Kansas.

I have just received from Miss Ruth Tracksel, of the Appointment Service at Stanford, Edward's records and recommendations as filed in that office.

We have a position open here in the Department of Physical Education at a salary of \$2400.00 for 9½ months. Our department offers a B. S. degree in the School of Education with a major in physical Education. We are also offering graduate work with a major in physical education. Our graduate work started last summer.

I am writing you confidentially to see if you think your brother would be interested in this position. I recognize that the Plains States do not offer as lucrative a salary as the Coast schools. I would like to get your viewpoint regarding the possibility of his being interested in this position before going further.

I have looked over his credentials and I am very sure that he would fit very nicely in our scheme of things.
