December 28

December 29

Today we passed time by riding subways, riding excursion boats, and seeing movies before leaving at 4:00 o'clock for Philadlephia. Upon arriving we immediately went to the Swarthmore field house for a brief work-out and then to Strath Haven Inn, where we will stay for the next two evenings. We all listened to the President's preach this evening before going to bed.

December 30
