of the better colleges of America could be brought in to a scheme that would prove a mighty force in striking out against proselyting and rank professional alism in college sport. The salary for such a man should be sixty to seventy-five thousand dollars, and the tenure should be for life.

Instead of divorcing this man from college sports, he would be very intimately associated with the colleges because it would be from the authority of the presidents that this man would derive his power. The salary of \$75,000

would be no great obstacle because each school would pay its share according to the student population. The small college of 350 would pay its proportionate part of the salary as would a university with 20,000 enrolled.

This High Commissioner should of necessity be legally trained for the purpose of writing constitution and by-laws for the conferences and the colleges of America under which they would operate. The odium on college athletics would be lifted because there would be a confidence in the adminis-
