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To my question as to whether Mr. Irwin had ever requested ~~detectives~~ ^{detectives} to mingle with the throng to apprehend known bookmakers and gamblers, he couldn't give me a definite answer, both from not knowing personally whether this request had been made, and also from the viewpoint that the P. D. would not make known the requests in its files.

However he did say that the P. D. at the present time could not assign ten or fifteen men to this task because of the shortage of men. They are however he explained trying to trap known bookmakers and gamblers, and they also have assigned men to watch the hotels where the meeting teams stop to see that the boys are not approached. (A fine state of affairs) They (the ~~detectives~~ ^{detectives}) recognize how hard it is to make an arrest for gambling and make the charge stick before a Magistrate. Many innocent men (alumni) with pride in their school, wager a small amount. If they were arrested they would be discharged and the sport writers would immediately begin a Campaign of "Persecution".
