Dear Dean Swarthout:

I have letters in my possession from Dr. E. I. Camtson, Director of the Health Service, and Dr. W. G. Emery, of Bernard, the physician of Miss Margaret Gurley. Dr. Camtson states as follows:

"Margaret Gurley was graded 'C' on her physical examination September 20, 1942. Any further arrangements she made to participate in physical exercises were on her own initiative and against the advice of her doctor."

Dr. Emery further testifies as family physician that it was inadvisable for Miss Gurley to take equestrian, which according to the hospital records she was not required to take. Upon insistence of some of her sorority sisters she did this work, but a number of absences occurred due to her physical condition which caused her to receive an "F" in the course.

Under these conditions I would recommend that Miss Gurley be withdrawn from the course and no unfavorable grade marked against her record.
