## K. U. Five A Feature

### Squads to See Prospective Big Six Champions

The Kansas university basketball squad has never been taken away from the campus except for a basketball game, Dr. Phog Allen writes F. B. Toalson, principal of the senior high school, and he adds, "You are the first man who ever has been able to sell me on the idea."

"When you pointed out that college bands and musical organizations make promotional trips for public relations development for their school, I rather agreed that perhaps the basketball squad can do the same thing, although I still think the thing could be overdone."

So when Dr. Allen brings his varsity squad here for the two day basketball clinic next week, it will be the squad's first trip away from home as an educational program.

"It is an educational program," Dr. Allen's letter said, "And I believe could not be criticized more than bringing the university band to Dodge City to play a concert."

Utica, Shallow Water, Ford and Liberal high school teams are new entries for the clinic here next week, which brings the total of teams to thirty, including the senior high and junior college teams of Dodge City, Mr. Toalson said. The junior high team has decided not to enter the clinic unless there are other junior high teams in it.

With thirty teams to work, the clinic play will start Thursday afternoon with each team playing a half against another and the coaches of both teams sitting with Dr. Allen for his suggestions and criticisms as the teams play. In addition his varsity squad from the university will stage demonstrations in the program. "We will be prepared to give any demonstration you want," Dr. Allen said.

The K. U. team also will give a demonstration Friday night of the clinic between halves of the Emporia-Dodge City high school game which will be the closing feature of the clinic.
