The letter from Allen to Wede-p n king included a paragraph or two was regarding Glenn's visit:

Well, this is exactly what it turn. ed out to be because Mr. Glenn not only lent his enthusiastic support but talked to the team members before the game started and gave them a fine pep talk."

That the local basketball expert helped a great deal on his trip to Lawrence is the contention of Allen for his writes further:

"I am sure that Glenn's presence contributed materially to the victory. He is a swell fellow and everybody liked him very much. If ever we go through Beardstown, John Glenn will be number one on the list and the Campus Inn will be the second place we will stop.

"I do not know whether you listen in on station WREN or not, but the other night when they broadcast our game they mentioned that Mr. Glenn was in our midst and gave him quite a build-up. They also announced it over the public address system at the game."
