

The University Band and her organizations line up our boys in a wonderful way.



After reading your letter carefully I am reminded of a similar case, that of Warren Smith, also a Baker man, who has been going to the University of Southern California for graduate work. He lacks but three hours and his theses. He is teaching in the lawrence schools, and in order to save the expense of going to California desired to finish his work here.

He found on investigation that in order to get a Master's degree from K. U. he would have to do 30 hours in residence, and that they would not transfer any credit from Southern California.

Your case is very similar, and I would suggest that you finish at Iowa even at the expense of doing a completely different thesis.
