Dear Doctor Allen;

I harbor no adverse feeling toward you in the matter of the radio incident of the other evening. I do not hold you responsible in any way for this 'infringement' of time.

Naturally, and because of the nature of the selection that I had chosen, I had hoped to finish it. It was the type of piece, which in order to be justified, needed the climax. The interest is progressive in this piece as in many, and naturally all this was lost. The loss of a minute or two from a talk or musical selection robs it of its effectiveness with the result that the purpose is dissipated. But let me assure you again that I felt no trespassing on your part. I do feel that it should be the policy of the station to avoid these overlappings. You, nor I, are responsible for this lack of co-ordination in time, but I do think that the station should avoid these conflicts.

I appreciate your expression of interest in my playing and want to thank you for this.

I hope that we may have the pleasure of sharing another half hour at K.F.K.U.
